

## PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING

At Highwood Primary School we were allocated £68,900 Pupil Premium funding to support children that have been entitled to Free School Meals for the last 6 years. This funding is received in April and covers the financial year and not the school year. At present we have 58 children entitled to pupil premium funding.

Careful consideration is given as how to spend pupil premium funding. We look at the performance and need of every child and where appropriate, work with staff and families to support the children. Broadly Pupil Premium money is used to support 3 areas and different forms of provision.

The impact of this work is closely monitored and the school's aim is to ensure there is no gap between the pupil premium and non-pupil premium children.

The gap between pupil premium and non-pupil premium children is shown below.

However, these gaps are not replicated throughout the school. The percentage gap in reading, writing and maths in each year group is as follows;
