Welcome to our first Foundation 1 News this year. We have had a very busy start to the Autumn Term in F1. All the children have settled incredibly well and have begun making friends. We have begun exploring our termly topic 'what makes us special?' which has allowed us all to get to know each other and explore ourselves as individuals.

As part of our topic we have been learning about ourselves and our bodies and exploring how amazing and different they all are. The children had the opportunity to paint their own self-portraits by looking in the mirrors and discussing what they look like and have created a height chart so we can see how our bodies are all different shapes and sizes. We have also been busy beginning to share our 'all about me' boxes that the children have created at home (which are all amazing). These have allowed the children to understand







that we are all unique for example, we live in different lives, like different things and have different families.

As part of learning about our amazing bodies we have been exploring '**The 5 Senses**' and engaging in lots of exciting activities to enable us to use our senses to learn more. This half of term we have focused mostly on <u>touch</u> and <u>taste</u>. In order for us to explore touch and feel, the children have explored lots of different sensory plays such as cornflour and Gelli Baff, done painting using their hands and feet and participated in a 'what's inside the mystery box?' game. To explore taste, the children have discussed their likes and dislikes and





also participated in a fruit tasting activity. We will also be exploring Halloween using our senses, by carving pumpkins and baking some Halloween biscuits.



F1 has really enjoyed participating in P.E where we have been developing our listening skills and our gross motor movements. We have been learning lots of new games such as the 'hoop game' which helps the children to follow direction and listen well. They have also been practicing their balance and climb-

ing skills. All the children have been showing great perseverance when trying to get in and out of their P.E kits independently.

Lots of fun has been had engaging in role play this half term. Outside the children have been exploring the doctor's surgery, where they have been learning more about their bodies and the way they work and inside they have been exploring the house home corner which has been encouraging them to discuss their own homes and families and represent their experiences in their play.

Topic and Science




The children began by learning all about the Tour de France, the Tour of Britain and our very own Tour of Highwood which will be taking place soon after

Year 2 News

Was the Great Fire of London a total disaster?

This half-term has flown by! The children have started to settle into year 2 well and seem to be really enjoying school. They have shown great enthusiasm for our topic and already have lots of useful knowledge about the Great Fire of London. This halfterm we have been focusing on writing to inform in Literacy. The children have retold the events of the Great Fire of London.

They have also created a fact file about Tudor artefacts which we borrowed from Reading Museum!



We started off the term by looking at nonfiction texts about the Great Fire and sequenced pictures of the events on a timeline. Then we wrote our own sentences about the pictures in the book. To help make our sentences more interesting we learnt about adjectives to describe the fire, as well as the people and their emotions. We re-lived the day the fire

started and acted it out through drama. We used time connectives to sequence the events.

We have been learning all about place value in maths. We learned our number bonds to 20 and the children are starting to learn the related subtraction facts. It would be great if you could continue this at home. We have learnt about how you can write numbers up to 100 as words. The children have also learnt how to show numbers in different representations, including numicon, dienes and money. They have compared numbers using the < > = symbols.



We have also been looking for patterns in maths. The children have been consolidating their ability to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. They have learnt how to write multiplication as a repeated addition pattern. They have also been looking at the relationship between multiplication and we will explore this further next half term.

As Scientists, we have been learning all about different materials and linking this to materials in 1666, particu-



larly wooden houses. Can your child tell you the properties of different materials from around your home?

We have had a fantastic half-term and I cannot wait for next half-term. Well done Year 2, see you soon!

LITERACY

This term we have been looking at fairy tales. In guided reading we have



all been looking at Hansel and Gretel by Anthony Browne.

In English we have been writing fairy tales. Sometimes we changed ones we



already knew. Then we made up our own and wrote them neatly so that they can be displayed.



MATHS

In maths we have been working with numbers up to 1000. We have been partitioning and writing the numbers

in words. We have been adding 10 and 100 to a number and are just about to look at written methods.



SCIENCE

In science we have been looking at rocks, soil and fossils. We have sorted and



organised rocks based on their properties and tested them. We have learnt all about fossils and Mary Anning who we pretended to interview.



TOPIC

In topic we have been looking at prehistoric times. We started with timelines and organised key events. Then we having been looking at prehistoric animals and how people in the stone age lived and ate.

Welcome to the first edition of the Year 4 news! I am pleased to say that we've had a fantastic start to the school year, with lots of exciting opportunities and lots of new learning going on. Please read on to find out more!

Which of our senses is the most important?

To begin answering our question, we explored the different sounds we could hear in the



playground. We created a detailed list and then used them in our science. Year 4 then looked at how different animals have unique senses that help them to stay safe, hunt for prey and make sense of the world around them. We learned some interesting facts such as, 'a dog can hear sounds as high as 40,000 Hz' and 'a falcon can see an object from 1.5 Km'.

have explored Roman Numerals and are able to use their knowledge to create numbers up 100 (some even beyond 100). They have learned all about counting up in different multiples and are able to represent it using resources and abstract concepts.

English

We have been learning about 'writing to inform' and have created our own dragon fact files. We learned how to



add in description using adjective noun phrases, conjunctions and sub headings.

ent animals and how they fit together in food chains. We have been looking at their properties and learning how to classify them into different

Welcome to the first edition of the Year 5 news! I am pleased to say that we've had a fantastic start to the school year, with lots of exciting opportunities and lots of new learning going on. Please read on to find out more!

Literacy - Firework Maker's Daughter.

The book 'The Firework Makers Daughter' by Philip Pullman addresses a dilemma, which a young Chinese girl called Lila faces, when she realises she has to climb a mountain and face **PE - Pyroclastic, Gymnastic.** This half term the children a fire fiend to become a true firework maker. The children settings, we have also focussed on character roles. We have to improve their EXPLOSIVE routines. used a variety of retrieval exercises to develop comprehension skills and we have put ourselves in the situations of each char-

acter to feel empathy for them when faced with difficult decisions.



Maths - Place Value and finding patterns.

Our maths lessons this half term have really supported us in learning about space. We have been looking at the place val-



as counting beyond zero (negative 1, negative 2, etc.) and rounding numbers to different degrees of accuracy. We have designed decimal games, written our own number riddles and made number lines to put our learning into practise!

Science In Science we have been looking at materials and which ones are effective for everyday life. We have compared materials and investigated why certain materials are more effective for particular uses. We have learnt about their properties and categorised them. We have been testing them for strength using Newton Meters, this in turn has helped us Well done, Year 5, on making this to read scales.

Music - eRAPtions. In Music we have been thinking carefully about Volcanic eruptions, we started with brainstorming words and then thought about how we would represent each stage of the eruption. We then thought carefully about which instruments would be best for

representing that particular stage. We wrote Volcano Raps and poems using the vocabulary and literacy skills learnt this half term to help us.

> Geography/Topic - Has the Earth finished growing We enjoyed making Papier-Mache Volcanoes for our homework project and we also worked on our mixing of colours to paint them in a realistic way. Then they were ready to test out using our science knowledge. We mixed bicarbonate of soda with vinegar and stood back to see the reaction! It was great to see the volcanoes in action; however, we were also curious to find out why some eruptions were better than others. We then tested the amount of carbon dioxide gas that was released using balloons over plastic bottles. We still have some thinking to do about the best ratio of bicarbonate of soda to

vinegar though.

Year 6 News

Welcome to the first newsletter for Year 6. Although we have only been back in school a matter of weeks, we have already achieved a lot. Our topic this term is, 'How do we shape the world and how does the world shape us?', and we have been thinking about this through English and Science.

English

In English, we have been studying a fantastic book, 'Skellig' by David Almond. It is a story about a boy who discovers a unique (and previously undiscovered) creature in his garage. Through our reading of the text, we have been investigating how an author hooks a reader as well as using the events of the story to create persuasive adverts that





put a positive spin on a negative house. We are currently looking at how we can write to entertain and use grammar and sentence structure to reveal a character's feelings.

Maths

So far in maths, the children have been securing their understanding of place value. They have been learning how to read, write and compare large numbers (up to 10,000,000) and numbers with 3 decimal places. More recently, we have been investigating negative numbers and their uses in the wider world from recording and comparing temperatures to keeping track of our finances! Soon, we will be delving into rounding and number sequences so all our learning of place value will come in really handy!

Science

If someone discovers a new living thing (for the first time), how might they name it? With this question in mind, the children have been look-



ing at the classification and naming of living things and soon they will be looking at how Linnaeus came up with his binominal classification and classifying some organisms of their own.

Geography

We have been looking at Central America in preparation for our History focus on the ancient Maya. So far, we have looked at the tropics and the equator and why the climate is the way it is in these places. Following this, we will be looking at the rainforest habitat (and biome!) and comparing it with that of the United Kingdom so as to

better understand how the Maya grew as a civilization compared to the Anglo-Saxons.

PE This term the children have enjoyed learning some very en-



ergetic dances in Zumba. I have been amazed at the speed at which they have learnt the steps, and with their enthusiasm.

Art

In Art, we have started to look at birds from Central



America and their varied and incredible colours. Following this, we will be talking closer look at bird skeletons and practising our use of shade to create a sense of lighting.

Reading

In our reading, we have been looking

at the skills of skimming and scanning to quickly find the right information from a text. Moreover, we have been looking at how characters are created through details that are stated and implied and how we can use evidence to back up what we understand.

Parents, the children should be asking you to read with them on a regular basis - I'm hoping they can show off what they have been learning so far!

We have been very busy in Resource exploring different types of Poetry this half term. We began with rhyming and made our own rhyming strings before re-writing an animal poem that rhymes and making our own funny limericks! We also thought of ideas to add to a rainbow colours poem, and investigated alliteration and similes in shape poems. In the last week of this half term, we will be looking at free verse with some of our children, reading and discussing Revolting Rhymes by Roald Dahl. Look out next half term for our unit on stories, with our key question 'Does a story have to have a happy ending'?

Maths-Investigating Number Systems, Pattern Sniffing and Solving Calculation Problems





It's been all about Number this half term with the youngest members of the Resource extending their counting beyond 10 and finding one more and one less and others investigating place value, number sequences, odd and even numbers, estimating using a number line and using their skills in addition and subtraction.



Well Done to all the resource children for settling in well to our new group, therapy room and resource classroom. We have been impressed with the teamwork and perseverance shown so far this term.

Welcome to the first half term "PE & Sports News Page" of 2018.

Autumn Half Term Matches & Tournaments:

PE Lessons:

This half term the children have been learning about the health, fitness and wellbeing side of PE. I have been able to test the children's overall fitness together with heart rate results. This has made very interesting reading! KS1 have learnt about the heart and its importance to keep healthy. They have also been testing out the circuits in readiness for their testing in KS2. In KS2 the children were partnered up to encourage motivation and score keeping and to discourage inflated figures! There were 6 stations working different parts of the body to gain an overall picture of the children's fitness. All of their repetitions were recorded and input into a data sheet. The minimum targets of total repetitions are between 140 for yr3 and 170 for yr6. In total, KS2 48% of children managed this minimum standard. This is 10% down on last year. That leaves 52% of the school in need of encouragement to do more physical activity out of school. I am happy to share your child's individual results if you are interested. We have also been playing football working on the skills such as control, pass & receive, targets, positional & strategy work.

Year 6 have also had an extra session taking part in Dance with Miss King.

We have also had the introduction of Miss Rowse teaching year 5, 3. FS2 and team teaching with year 1W in gymnastics.
