Recruitment update - Deputy Headteacher

During the last few weeks I have shown around nine prospective candidates for the Deputy Headteacher position, which has resulted in eight application forms being submitted before the deadline. The consultation is due to take place on Wednesday 22nd February from 3:30pm until 7:30pm in Highwood's main hall.

We started the half term with F1 going to the Arctic to look at the sky, investigate the ice, they even had their very own igloo! F2 made rockets and then took off in one to land on the moon to see if the sky was blue from space!










The children have been looking at shape and patterns. F2 have been learning how to describe a shape using its properties and have also began to recognise number patterns. F1 have also been looking at patterns in their maths activities.

Year 1 News

All of our learning this half term is focused on our topic question 'Will we play with the same toys when we are older?'

This half term, in literacy, we have been writing to inform with the focus on writing to persuade. At the beginning of term we created Lego models in pairs and then we have spent the term writing why Lego models are fantastic





After this piece of writing we have focused on how to write a letter. We are writing a letter to Lego head quarters persuading them to send us some free Lego to help us with our school project. Throughout all these pieces of writing we have continued to work on having capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in each sentence. However, there has been a huge emphasis on making our sentences more interesting using a wider range of vocabulary. In particular we have focused on using adjectives to de-

scribe the noun, time connectives and using the word 'and' to join two simple sentences. We continue to develop our phonics



knowledge with a clear emphasis on spelling words with the correct sounds. For example, before the children may have written the word play like this—plai.

Next term we will build on this by writing to entertain and the focus will be on story writing.

In mathematics the children have improved their number sense by practising counting backwards from 100 and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We used music, cubes, our shoes and anything but hands to practice counting by 2s, 5s and 10s. This is still a work in progress but the children understand that counting in 2s, 5s and 10s helps counting bigger amounts faster. We learnt about doubling numbers, odd and even numbers, and fractions. In fractions we have



learnt about half of an object, shape and then amount. The children understand that a half means splitting a whole into two equal parts that

are the same. Next term we will be focusing on quarters and continuing to learn to count in 5s and 10s, along with learning about arrays and money.

In science, At the beginning of the term we continued our materials topic and conducted an experiment about why plastic is the best material for Lego. The children loved this and had lots of fun! The rest of the term is based on animals including humans. So far we have learnt

about different animals and the 6 main animal groups. We have been sorting animals into those groups and understanding the characteristics of each group type.



We thank you for your support in reading with your child at home and for helping them to complete their homework. We have had 100% of the class complete their homework every week! More and more children are reading 4 to 5 times a week, This will ensure they continue to make good progress!



Year 2 News

Our learning this half term is focused on our topic title, 'be the change you want to see in the world'. During this topic we have been looking specifically at India.



This half term, in literacy we have been writing to inform with the focus on writing to persuade. At the beginning of the term we learnt all about different types of Indian transport. The children looked at the simi-


larities and differences between them and used adjectives and adverbs to describe them and how they move.

Following on from this, the children have designed their own Indian transport using their ICT skills. They then used what they had learnt to describe their own transport. Using their descriptions, the children wrote persuasive arguments to try and convince me that I should use their transport.

During this work, the children learnt about questions, ex-



clamations and commands as well as how to use conjunctions, such as when, and, but, because. Throughout all these pieces of writing we have continued to work on having capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in each sentence. However, there has been a huge emphasis on making our sentences more interesting using a wider range of vocabulary. We continue to develop our phonics knowledge with a clear emphasis on spelling. We are also doing weekly spellings to teach words that do not use phonics. Next term we will be building on this by writing to entertain and the focus will be on story writing.



In mathematics the children have learnt about doubling numbers, odd and even numbers, and fractions. In fractions we have learnt about halves.

quarters and thirds of an object, shape and then amount. The children understand that when we split a shape or amount into fractions, each part must be equal. Next term we will be continuing to learn

about fractions. We will move on to finding multiple fractions of amounts. For example two quarters of 12 instead of one quarter.



In science, the children have been learning about animals and their habitats. So far we have learnt about different animals and four main types of different habitats, including, grasslands, deserts and the polar regions. We have looked at the conditions in each habitat and why it is suitable for the animals which live there. The children have drawn an animal in the correct habitat and explained why it is suitable.

and more children are reading 4 to 5 times a week, This will ensure they continue to make good progress! The attendance of the class has

been fantastic so far this term and we have won the attendance award 3 weeks in a row!

NUMERACY



The children have worked very hard in Maths this term to understand the tricky concept of fractions. We started by looking at what a fraction is by finding out that they are part of a whole or a group. By using equipment the children had fun experimenting


HISTORY

One of my favourite topics, Ancient Egypt, has allowed the children to delve deep into this fascinating era of history. We started off by consolidating our map skills by using atlases to find out more about the geography of Egypt. Next we used a timeline to find out when Ancient Egypt actually happened. Our first visit to the Highwood Tomb allowed Year 3 to understand more about Ancient Egyptian artefacts as they took on the role of archaeologists searching for old relics in the sand.





Using iPads, the children were able to find out about each item they found and then produced fact files.



the different attractions. We used this as inspiration to create our own fairground-themed classroom! We



Changes: Does Change Always Lead to Progress?

English



We started the term reading, Box', and how Pandora's deed changed humanity for ever. We thought how we would behave if we were given a parcel but were told not to open it. Although most of the children were

tempted to open it, they were then very unforgiving of Pandora when she opened the box!



We used the story to inspire our writing. We retold the story from Pandora's point of view; we wrote a character description of Epimethius; we pretended to be Epimethius and wrote a letter to Pandora either forgiving her for her deeds, or (in the case of most of the children) demanding a divorce!

We held a book-tasting session, when we tried different books just to see if we could make a change to what we usually read.



Maths

In maths we have continued to practise our arithmelearning and studying 'Pandora's tic and have improved the speed and accuracy of our calculations. We then moved on to learning about fractions (fractions of numbers, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting).

Topic—The Industrial Revolution



Before we started to study the industrial revolution, we looked at what Britain was like before. We looked at paintings of the English landscape before

1750, and used these to create our own landscape pictures.

We are now beginning to carry out our own research on an aspect of change in the industrial revolution. The children are working on a variety of projects including: changes in technology and transport; the effect of change on housing and cities; the lives of children who worked in factories.

In science, we began the term by learning about

light: how it travels, how shadows are formed, how we see reflected light. We then used our knowledge to create shadow puppets which we used to retell the story of Pandora's

Phone App

I have included information about the phone app for a second time for those new parents to the school.

Highwood Primary School has a mobile app! It is designed to keep you well informed about your child's education and life in general at school. You can find out about the latest news, events, curriculum information and contact details all from the comfort of your smartphone or tablet. It has been developed with the smaller screen in mind and is very easy to use and navigate around.

If you have any questions regarding the app, or any features you feel would enhance it, please leave your ideas with the school office.

How to download the app

You can get the app if you have an Apple or Android phone and/or tablet. There are two ways:

Coding club

Coding club has been a great success, 20 children meet with Mr Anderson every week to learn about various aspects of coding. It has proved so popular that we have enough pupils to fill another session on the waiting list. There will be an opportunity next term for those children who are still expressing an interest at that time.

I would also like to welcome our new 'Digital Leaders' from year five, they were involved in many aspects of coding last

year from the club to that of the Cluster coding day at Bulmershe which will be going ahead for the current Year Four pupils later in the year. There will be details to follow next term.



We will be continuing our relationship with the Bulmershe School ICT department. There will be opportunities for the children in the coding club to join children from Beechwood Primary, to receive further support from Bulmershe students, as well as a hands on approach to using some of the latest technology control units, such as the BBC Micro bit.

As part of our school commitment to supporting parents, I would like to hold a session one evening in March in supporting parents with coding. There will be both an explanation of how we use code in school both on the PC's and iPads and there will be an opportunity to try out some of the software for yourselves.

We hope parents will sign up for the hour long session as this will help you to provide support at home and have an understanding as to why it is taught in schools.

On Thursday 16th March from 5.30pm - 6.30pm, Mr Anderson will be running a coding workshop for our parents and carers. Coding is an important part of the school curriculum and this session is aimed at demystifying coding and giving you ideas and ways of supporting your children at home with coding.

In addition, we have a session in March on identifying and supporting your child with anxiety. This session is run by trained counsellors and is aimed at identifying anxiety and strategies of how you can support your child to successfully manage anxiety.

Adult learning will be running a programme for us in June on preparing your child and supporting them with the transition to secondary school. This programme covers a wide range of topics on how to support your child emotionally and practically in the transition to secondary and we are very excited to have the opportunity to run it at Highwood.
