In maths we looked at time and money. We have learnt to read and write the o'clock and half past times. We also did some prob-


lem solving around time where the children had to read a statement and work out what time it was. We then went on to





Year 2 News

Not long before it will your child's final half term in Year 2! The time has absolutely flown.

The children have now finally completed all of their SATs during this half term! The children tried so hard and were excellent at coping without adult support during this time. They definitely deserve the half-term break!

We have begun our new topic "what is the difference between a cake and a biscuit?" The children started this topic by linking biscuits with symmetry and instructions! Their challenge was to decorate biscuits as symmetrically as possible. Look how symmetrical they are! In Literacy, they then used their biscuits to write instructions to tell someone else how to decorate their biscuit.







In maths we revisited many concepts, including time, money, pattern and measurement. At the start of the term, the chil-

dren learnt how to use a ruler for measurement and when to use mm, cm and m. They could also tell me how many mm in a cm and cm in a m! The children particularly enjoyed revisiting money

and solved some challenging exercises, such as making 25p ten different ways and solving worded money problems! When we revis-

ited time, Year 2 learnt the difference between clockwise and anticlockwise. Can they

show you which way is clockwise? They were excellent at showing quarter, half, and three quarter turns going clock-



wise/anticlockwise when using an arrow

In science we are learning about plants and asking the question, what do plants need to grow and be healthy? We have drawn diagrams and learnt the names for different

parts of a plant. We have also begun an investigation into what plants need to grow and survive. During this we have discussed fair test and how to test objectively. We will



continue with our investigations next term.

I'm sure they will give us interesting results.

Finally, some children will be retaking the phonics screening check. So, this term we also worked hard on our phonics, the test will be the second week back to school and we need to be ready! The children seem confident and know their sounds well. Please read with them as much as possible, especially over half term to prepare them.

Year 3 News—Summer 1 Miss Abbott & Mrs Turnbull

As the sun has started to shine, the children have continued to do the same and making a great effort with their learning. I am already feeling sad that I only have one more term left with this lovely class.

The Stone Age—Why did people build Stonehenge?

LITERACY

We started this term by learning how to retell fairy tales and the children soon discovered it wasn't as easy as it seemed! We used lots of drama to help the class use detail in their retelling.





We even learnt how to use the present perfect tense to write 'newsflash style sentences' about what the 'Three Little Pigs' and 'Goldilocks' have been up to.

We then used the book 'Stone Age Boy' to find out more about what life was like in the Neolithic era. The children continued to develop their descriptive writing as they wrote in role sending postcards





NUMERACY

from the Stone Age.

This term we have been exploring shape which involved looking at lines, angles and 2D shapes. The children have worked hard to understand horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines and enjoyed creating these with their bodies!



Using inspiration from the artist Kandinsky, the class then created their own pieces of art work using a range of shapes and lines.

The children showed creativity and perseverance to keep adding detail to their work.



Science

This term, the children finally had the chance to learn about plants and carry out some exciting plant experiments. Each group investigated what a plant would need in order to grow well and over the course of 2 weeks, the children observed and photographed their two plants.

Learning about the role of the stem was a highlight for some of the children as we discovered that only artificial food dye worked when

we coloured the water! The results were so pretty!



SPANISH



Year 3 are continuing to make great progress with

their linguistic skills and are now able to hold a lengthy conversation. They can confidently count to 30, greet someone and say their name, talk about favourite colours and pets.

Welcome to the Summer 1 edition of the Year 4 news! We have had lots of cross curricular fun, with 'Castles' and 'The Iron Man' book/film as a focus and stimulus.

Literacy - The Iron Man

This term we have been reading the book 'The Iron Man' and we watched the film 'The Iron Giant'. We made comparisons between the book and film looking at settings



and building character profiles. We wrote reviews and explained why we thought one genre was better or



worse than the other. We also wrote some iron man poetry and used the book to inspire us to generate our poems which told the story.

adjectives to describe. We also made clay iron man heads with a focus on

imperative verbs and we looked in depth at instructional writing. We evaluated the effectiveness of the instructions, using the clay models to help us to evaluate. Again I have



been very pleased with the impact of my learning loops display. The children use it regularly to see what their next steps to learning will be and use it to help them gather ideas from others work and the WAGOLL -What a good one looks like.

Maths - Shape, Perimeter and Area

In maths we have been learning about 'Shapes and area' and we have been using a variety of methods, for

example using our bodies to construct different triangles and angles. We have been measuring the area of items in the large hall, using trundle wheels as well as the traditional rulers. We have been



solving problems and creating problems for others to solve. The homework has incorporated many aspects of



shape and area, take a look at the KS2 art area, here you will be able to see some fabulous castles, made from a variety of media.

History - Castle Life

We have been finding out about castles and discussed the question, 'Why would someone build a castle here?' We have been learning about the different parts of a castle and how they would have defended themselves against an attacking enemy. We also looked at how they were built high up, both to make them more difficult to attack, but also this forms a good vantage point, spotting the attacking enemy long before they

We have been finding out about who would have lived in the castle, from the king to the servants, who built many of our castles, with a main focus being on the We used onomatopoeia, similes, and Normans, William the conqueror and of course Corfe Castle which we will be visiting in July as part of our Swanage residential trip.

Science - States of matter.

During Science we have been learning about solids, liquids and gases. We were able to see how the states of matter change through several experiments, We even went



outside and acted as the particles of the 3 states of

We looked at reversible and irreversible reactions, including that of ice, condensation and evaporation, as well as separating solids from liquids.

ICT - Let's Animate. The Children have been using Animation software to create moving animations of 'The Iron Man' book study. The children have been excited about showing their animations, some of which I will try to add to my class page for

you to view. We are looking forward to continuing with the 'Castles' topic next half term.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for some fabulous Castle homework, as you can see from

the photo, they are pretty magnificent.


Are heroes and villains so different?

We used evidence from the text to illustrate the setting and used extracts to add detail. We then wrote our own descriptions, which were particularly gory but also disgustingly delightful! In preparation for the SATs we concentrated on practising reading comprehensions, learning grammar terms, improving the accuracy of our arithmetic and polishing up our maths reasoning. When it came to SATs week itself, the children applied themselves fantastically and I was extremely proud of the way in which they approached the assessments. They all behaved fantastically and did their very best. It was a pleasure to celebrate the end of SATs with a DVD and a class picnic!

English

We have been enjoying improving our writing skills over the last two weeks. The children have been working very closely with different teachers to improve the technical side of their writing: sentence structure, punctuation, spelling and handwriting. We have been enthused to do this by learning some



inspirational stories, and we have been encouraged by the huge improvements we have made in our work.

Science and Maths

In science and maths we have wondered about being 'healthy, wealthy and wise'. We started off by looking at the human circulatory system and finding out how the heart works.





Thank-you for your continued support.

I dissected a couple of lambs' hearts, so that we could see the different chambers. The children then recorded their observations by careful and accurate drawing.

Our heart is crucial to life, and we have thought about what we can do to keep our heart healthy.



As scientists, the children carried out an investigation to measure the affect of exercise on our heart. Some of us found it very difficult to find our pulse rate - luckily Mrs Haden was on hand with her Fitbit to reassure us that our hearts were beating!

We are now looking at the role that different types of food have in keeping our bodies healthy, and how to create a healthy diet for the differing needs of different people.

With the General Election looming, the children have been thinking about who they would like to be behind the door of Number 10. Each member of the class has chosen a person to find out about in order to write a biography and create an election campaign.

We've also created our own 'Top Trump' cards to play with to really test our knowledge and understanding of fractions of amounts. Next half term we will move on to working with money.

Please note that fidget spinners are allowed in schools at playtime and lunchtime only.

During lesson time they must be left in bags or lockers.

ABSENCE
