Welcome to our first Foundation 1 News this term! We have had a very busy first half term. The staff have worked hard to create an inviting learning space for the children to explore and use. With 27 new F1 children starting this term we have spent the first few weeks allowing them time to settle and to get to know the other children and staff.

Our Topic this term was "how are we unique?". To begin our topic we have all made boxes about ourselves. The children have enjoyed bringing them in and sharing them with our new friends. It is a great way for everyone to get to know each other and to find out what we like to do.



We looked at the book 'Goldilocks and the three bears'. The children enjoyed listening to the story. Our listening skills are already starting to improve! The children have enjoyed comparing themselves to others. We looked at the tallest and smallest people in the World and then we measured ourselves against them.



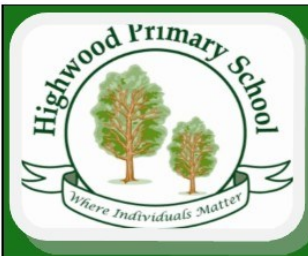
The children also looked at themselves in mirrors and drew self-portraits which have been displayed in the F2 corridor.

Year 1 News - Autumn 1

What a fantastic start the children have had to Year 1! I have been so impressed how smoothly they have made the transition from Foundation to KS1 and I am very proud of each and every one of them for working so hard. The children have greatly enjoyed this term's topic so far and I hope they have been impressing you with their expert knowledge of bicycles! Have a lovely half term! Miss Abbott :)

Why do people ride bicycles?

Settling in

During our first week in Year 1, the children did lots of work on our learning behaviours. One of their



favourite activities is playing parachute games where they learnt the importance of teamwork. We also did some fun group activities such as building a marshmallow tower and finding things in



the classroom by doing a scavenger hunt, looking for coloured dots. By playing a 'getting to know you' game, the children found out about each other's favourite things whilst developing their independence skills.



Maths

This term has focussed on number and then children have worked hard to be able to improve their counting and number recognition. Using a range of objects, the children have practiced writing numbers in figures and words as well as counting out the correct number of objects to match.

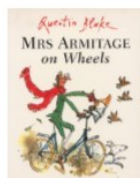


We have also worked on ordering numbers and counting forwards and backwards to 100 using number lines and number squares and then without any prompts at all!



English

This term we have been reading the story 'Mrs Armitage on wheels' to link with our topic on bicycles. We started by reading the story and then retelling it by putting pictures into the correct order.



Then the class used actions to be able to verbally retell the whole story. We have also learnt about writing a sentence by making sure

we say the sentence aloud before we write it down as well as including adjectives and the correct punctuation!

Year 1's creative skills really flourished when they designed imaginative objects to go onto their own bicycles, such as a fire



boosts, fidget spinner horn and sparkly, spotty nightlights. Some of the children then presented their team's ideas to the class before working on their own designs.



Topic and Science

The children started off our topic lessons by asking questions of things they wanted to know or find out about bicycles. They then used books and ICT to find some of the answers. Using atlases, the class have developed their maps skills by locating countries of the United Kingdom. Recently the children used their chronological understanding to show a timeline of the history of bicycles.



In science we have been learning about materials and the children have sorted objects in to the different materials as well as understanding the difference between an object and the material it is made of.

Year 2 News

Was the Great Fire of London a total disaster?

This half-term has flown by! The children have started to settle into year 2 well and seem to be really enjoying school. They have shown great enthusiasm for our topic and already have lots of useful knowledge about the Great Fire of London. This half-term we have been focusing on writing to inform in Literacy. The children have retold the events of the Great Fire of London.



They have even written in role as Samuel Pepys to write a diary of events!

We started off the term by looking at non-fiction texts about the Great Fire and sequenced pictures of the events on a timeline. Then we wrote our own sentences about the pictures in the book. To help make our sentences more interesting we learnt about adjectives to describe the fire, as well as the people and their emotions. We really tried to empathise with Samuel Pepys when writing in role. We re-lived the day the fire started from his point of view and acted it out through drama. The children were excellent at understanding his emotions.



As one of our trip activities, the children have had a visit from the firemen this half-term. They asked them lots of exciting questions and learnt lots about fire safety.

We have been learning all about place value in maths. We learned our number bonds to 20 and the children are starting to learn the related subtraction facts. It would be great if you could continue this at home. We have learnt about how you can write numbers up to 100 as words. The children have also learnt how to show numbers in different representations, including numicon, dienes and money. They have compared numbers using the $<$ $>$ $=$ symbols.

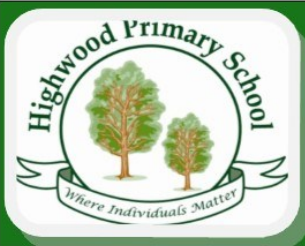


We have also been looking for patterns in maths. The children have been consolidating their ability to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. They have learnt how to write multiplication as a repeated addition pattern. They have also been looking at the relationship between multiplication and division and are now able to undo a multiplication using division.



As Scientists, we have been learning all about different materials and linking this to materials in 1666, particularly wooden houses. Can your child tell you the properties of different materials from around your home?

We have had a fantastic half-term and I cannot wait for next half-term. Well done Year 2, see you soon!



Year 3 News

What was life like for a Roman child?

Our first half term in KS2 is complete. This half term we've been trying really hard to be independent. Read on to see all the exciting things we have been up to.

LITERACY

This term we used the story of Romulus and Remus to inspire our own writing. First we studied and learnt the story. We discussed how Rome got its name and thought about how stories change as they are passed down orally. Then we thought about origin stories for Highwood. We decided on our setting and chose our characters. Then we planned and wrote our stories. There was some wonderfully creative writing. Now we're thinking about reading aloud our writing and setting the right mood.



MATHS

In maths we've been looking at numbers up to 1000. We have been writing and reading them and using equipment to help consolidate our place value. We have looked at mental strategies and practised bridging over 10 and 100. Now we have been looking at using formal column methods for addition and subtraction. With our times tables we have been thinking about the inverse division facts we know.



SCIENCE

This half term we have been investigating magnets. We have looked at the materials that are attracted to magnets and tested to see how strong they are. We have researched which materials a magnet can attract through and thought about the poles. Using our creativity and reflection skills we also considered the positives and negatives of having magnetic hands.



TOPIC

In topic we have been thinking about what life was like for a Roman child. We have found where Italy and Rome are on a map and looked at the spread of the Roman Empire. After placing the Romans in a timeline, we looked at how only very rich boys got to go to school. Then we looked at Roman houses and thought about the main features of the villas. In Art we have been looking at mosaics.

Year 4 News

Teacher: Mr Allaway

Welcome to the first edition of the Year 4 news! I am pleased to say that we've had a fantastic start to the school year, with lots of exciting opportunities and lots of new learning going on. Please read on to find out more!

Which of our senses is the most important?

To begin answering our question, we explored the different sounds we could hear in the playground. We created a detailed list and then used them in our writing. Year 4 then looked at how different animals have unique senses that help them to stay safe, hunt for



prey and make sense of the world around them. We learned some interesting facts such as, 'a dog can hear sounds as high as 40,000 Hz' and 'a falcon can see an object from 1.5 Km'. In our science lessons we investigated how well our senses worked by blindfolding each other and touching different objects to different parts of our body. We discovered that our hands and lips were much more sensitive than our



back and feet. We experimented with our hearing in the playground and discovered we can hear much further when everyone speaks at the same time rather than separately.

Maths

In maths this term the children have spent a lot of time looking at numbers and



place value. They learned how to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 as well as how to order large numbers. Linking to our sense of touch, we looked at negative numbers and how temperature can plummet below zero. We are able to count backwards past zero and even find the difference between negative and positive numbers.



English

We have been learning about 'writing to inform' and have created our own animal fact files. We learned how to add in description using adjective and participle noun phrases, determiners and powerful verbs.



Meeting a guide dog!

A highlight of the half term was meeting Kashmir, an experienced guide dog, and her owner Jenny. We learned all about how people overcome the difficulty of losing a sense.

Has the Earth finished growing?

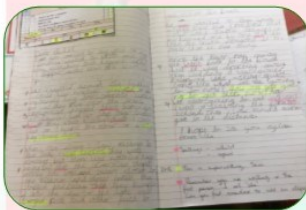
Welcome to the first edition of the Year 5 news! I am pleased to say that we've had a fantastic start to the school year, with lots of exciting opportunities and lots of new learning going on. Please read on to find out more!

Literacy - Firework Maker's Daughter.

The book 'The Firework Makers Daughter' by Philip Pullman addresses a dilemma that a young Chinese girl called Lila faces when she realises she has to climb a mountain and face a fire fiend to become a true firework maker. The children have been making use of the senses to write about imagined settings, we have also focussed on character roles. Mrs Raines has used a variety of retrieval exercises to develop comprehension skills and we



have put ourselves in the situations of each character to feel empathy for them when faced with difficult decisions.



Maths - Place Value and Patterns

Our maths lessons this half term have really supported us in learning about space. We have been looking at the place value of numbers up to and beyond 1,000,000 as well as counting beyond zero (negative 1, negative 2, etc.) and rounding numbers to different degrees of accuracy. We have designed decimal games, written our own number riddles and made number lines to put our learning into practise!



Science In Science we have been looking at materials and which ones are effective for everyday life. We have compared materials and investigated why certain materials are more effective for particular uses. We have learnt about their properties and categorised them. We have been testing them for strength using Newton Meters, this in turn has helped us to read scales.

Music - eRAPtions. In Music we have been thinking carefully about Volcanic eruptions, we started with brainstorming words and then thought about how we would represent each stage of the eruption. We then thought carefully about which instruments would be best for representing that particular stage. We wrote Volcano Raps and poems using the vocabulary and literacy skills learnt this half term to help us.

PE - Pyroclastic, Gymnastic. This half term the children have been improving their gymnastic skills, Mr Edwards has been monitoring their progress and teaching them new skills to improve their EXPLOSIVE routines.

Geography/Topic - Has the Earth finished growing

We enjoyed making Papier-Mache Volcanoes for our homework project and we also worked on our mixing of colours to paint them in a realistic way. Then they were ready to test out using our science knowledge. We mixed bicarbonate of soda with vinegar and stood back to see the reaction! It was great to see the volcanoes in action; however, we were also curious to find out why some eruptions were better than others. We then tested the amount of carbon dioxide gas that was released using balloons over plastic bottles. We still have some thinking to do about the best ratio of bicarbonate of soda to vinegar though.



We have done some thinking about whether the earth has finished growing. If you want to know our thoughts, just ask!

Well done, Year 5, on making this topic so incredibly interesting and thought-provoking. We hope you have learnt as much as we have!

It has been a super start to the year. We look forward to continuing this hard work after half term!

Literacy

We have written the story of Meerkat

Mrs Walker has written back, but she made some mistakes that we needed to spot. Through this work the children have done some brilliant reflection on how they are meeting their writing targets. Look out for some animal cooking in the last week of this half term and some fact file and Top Trumps work after our Resource Trip to The Living Rainforest.

Maths - Investigating Number Systems and Pattern



Sniffing

The children have done lots of activities for understanding numbers and place value for 2 digit numbers this half term. They have made numbers with Numicon, Diennes, bead strings, unifix cubes on 100 squares and number lines and written numbers in digits and words. Every Friday we like to put our understanding to the test with a problem solving activity. The children especially enjoyed making robot monsters of different sizes and using Numicon to calculate the total heights. In pattern sniffing, we have been spotting patterns related to the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.



Maple News

Literacy

This term the children have started on great form! They loved the story of Meerkat Mail and working with Willow Resource to retell the story!

The children then invented their own



characters and have written their own stories such as 'Rat Mail' or 'Tiger Mail'! They then used the iPads to publish their stories and turn them into real books for the KS1 classes to share.

We're now looking forward to completing some non-fiction work in the second half of the term and becoming 'animal experts'!

Maths - Investigating Number Systems and Pattern

Sniffing

The first half of term has gone well for the children. We have re-capped previous learning and really built on this with a slightly different approach to our Maths work. The children have



been expected to really explain their understanding and reasons for finding answers and I believe it's had a really positive effect on their learning. I've definitely seen a change in their ability to complete problem solving activities which is an area that they have all found challenging in the past.



PE/Sports News

Sports coach: Mr Edwards

Welcome to the first half term "PE & Sports News Page" of 2017.

PE Lessons:

This half term the children have been learning about the health, fitness and wellbeing side of PE. I have been able to test the children's overall fitness together with heart rate results. This has made very interesting reading! KS1 have learnt about the heart and its importance to keep healthy. They have also been testing out the circuits in readiness for their testing in KS2. In KS2 the children were partnered up to encourage motivation and score keeping and to discourage inflated figures! There were 6 stations working different parts of the body to gain an overall picture of the children's fitness. All of their repetitions were recorded and input into a data sheet. The minimum targets of total repetitions are between 140 for yr3 and 170 for yr6. In total, KS2 58% of children managed this minimum standard. This is a great improvement compared to previous years but we still have a long way to go. That leaves 42% of the school in need of encouragement to do more physical activity out of school. I am happy to share your child's individual results if you are interested. We have also been playing football working on the skills such as control, pass & receive, targets, positional & strategy work.



Year 6 have also had an extra session taking part in Zumba/Dance with Miss McNulty who is leaving us temporarily to have a baby. We wish her well and look forward to her return in the spring. In the meantime, Miss King will be covering her classes.

I am also teaching the indoor PE to year 5. We have started with Boccia & Kurling tournaments which have been very exciting.

A highlight of this half term has been the effort and enthusiasm from many of the children. In particular, I would like to mention Adrian Mohd Rizon, Chloe Hubbucks & Harun Zafar.
