IMPORTANT PLEASE READ

Dear Parents / Carers

In order to support the NHS track and trace system in the immediate days after the school term has ended, we have set up an emergency email address for parents to use:

alert@highwood.wokingham.sch.uk

This email address is to be used if any children test positive for Covid-19 and their symptoms started **<u>BEFORE</u>** Sunday 20th December at 1:30pm. The reason this date and time are crucial is that 48 hours prior to this date, the children will have been in contact with others at school. If this is the case, I would need to contact all the people in their class bubbles and let them know about the self-isolation period necessary to help prevent any potential transmission.

If you are contacting the school using this email to report a positive case, I will require the following information:

- Name and class of the child/ren who tested positive
- Other bubbles the child/ren may have been in contact with (Resource, Breakfast Club / Afterschool Club etc.)
- Date when the symptoms started
- Date of positive test results
- Details of any Highwood pupils your child may have had outside of school up to 48 hours before the symptoms started

If I am in the unfortunate position of having to make this contact, this will be done through the ParentMail app. If your details have changed then please let us know so we can update this on our system.

PLEASE DO NOT PHONE THE SCHOOL AND LEAVE A MESSAGE ON THE ANSWEPHONE, AS IT IS NOT MONITORED OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS.

Welcome to our Foundation 1 News. We have had a very busy second half of the Autumn Term in F1. We have continued exploring our termly topic 'what makes us special?' which has allowed us all to get to know each other and explore ourselves as individuals. We have been working on developing our confidence in groups and continuing to develop our independence.

After beginning to explore our senses in the first half of this term, we have continued to learn about the other senses which we use every day-touch, sight and hearing. We learnt all about firework night and the different sounds we might hear and used the torches in the dark to explore light and sight. The children have also been focusing on listening and hearing in phonics where they are learning to distinguish between different sounds they hear with their ears. To explore touch and feel we have been exploring lots of different texture messy plays and sensory trays.







As part of exploring our topic, 'what makes us special?', we have been encouraging the children to express their opinions and preferences. We have introduced a voting system at story time to allow the children to have a say in which story they listen to. They have really enjoyed this. We have also had discussions about things we like and don't like to recognise that everyone is different.

The children engaged in baking activities, sensory trays linked to the topics or events and role play activities using masks. The children also participated in many different craft activities such as painting pumpkins and making paper plate Diya lamps.









As part of learning how everyone is different and celebrating diversity, we have really focused on being kind and being a good friend this half of term. This tied in nicely with anti-bullying week where we made a promise to always try to be kind to each other by creating our kindness heart which is displayed in the classroom. We have done lots of circle times focused on the children's Personal, Social and Emotional development and helping them to learn how to deal with different situations.

wolf sneezed himself into space or ending up having a surprise party organised by the pigs! They have all worked so hard and should be proud of their amazing stories!




Reading and Writing

Looking back over this Autumn Term, I can't believe how much we have learnt and done. We have continued to address our question 'Does Change Always Lead to Progress?' through English, History, Science and the Arts. Year 6 would like to wish a Happy Christmas to all our families and friends.

English

We are thoroughly enjoying our whole class reading book 'Cogheart' by Peter Bunzl. It is an exciting adventure story that includes themes such as: what it means to be human; trust and betrayal; friendship and kindness.



In writing, we have used our knowledge of Art the Industrial Revolution to write biographies about influential men and women of the time, how their lives contributed to their successes, and how we benefit from their legacies today.

After half-term we immersed ourselves in poetry. We read and performed a variety of poems, and collected our favourite ones in our own anthology. We then wrote our own poems inspired by Robert MacFarland's Red Fox.

Maths



We have continued to hone our arithmetic skills and use them to solve mathematical problems. We loved learning about the order of operations, and were able to use BODMAS to solve number problems. Recently, we have explored the properties of 2D shape and used this knowledge to find missing angles.

Science

In Science, we started off finding out about Darwin and how he developed his theory of evolution. We investigated how the different beaks of finches had adapted over many generations so that they were better able to survive on the food that grew on different islands of the Galapagos.



We also studied the peppered moth, and how it adapted

to the environmental changes of the industrial revolution.

Recently, we have begun to build on our knowledge and understanding of electricity. We have learned the scientific symbols for electrical components, and how these can be combined to make a circuit.

As artists, we applied the skills of sketching and our knowledge of creating tone and texture to create our own peppered moths. We put all our moths together to produce a combined display that shows the variation in the patterns of the moth and how it has evolved.

History



As historians, we studied the impact that railways had on the people of Britain. And asked, whether they were a change for good or bad? We then looked at the development of the Great Western Railway and how Reading Station had changed over time.

In PE with Mr Edwards, the children have been learning about fitness and how important it is to exercise as well as learning how to coach others in ball skills. In gymnastics (with Miss Bocutt) we have created a performance using balances, jumps and travelling to tell a story.



Continual Improvement is one of our school values and Highwood wants to be the best school it can be for all our children and families. The survey is extremely positive and I would like to thank all parents for their feedback. In order to show parents the value in completing the survey, I will take this opportunity to address some of the areas that both the survey and comments raised.

Reading books

During the last two academic years, we have improved and added to our reading materials with approximately £6000 worth of investment on new books. These have included fully decodable books for our younger children; books for our Whole Class Reading Sessions and books for our main libraries. All children read or are read to everyday in school with books relating to the Key Questions.

Sadly, some of this allocation had to be spent on replacing the reading books we provided every child with during the first lockdown period that unfortunately were not returned to school.

Schools communication using a variety of media

We had a small number of parents disagree that we communicate effectively using a variety of media. As a school we are trying to reduce costs of mass photocopying when it is not necessary and use 'free' forms of communication, where possible. We realise that text messages are an easier way to contact parents, but it is worth noting for parents that each whole school text message costs us ± 21.38 , hence us using them sparingly.

The variety of communication we currently use is:

• Letters (when reply slips are required); Phone calls; Text messages; Emails; School App; Twitter; School Website; YouTube - (Parent Workshops; Meet the Teacher); Weekly bulletin emailed to all parents; Weekly Covid-19 updates; Half termly newsletter.

For me, communication is key. I would be really interested in having some feedback about how we can be more effective with our current methods and if there is a form of communication that we are missing.

Providing parents with Curriculum Information

We had some parents who disagreed that they get enough information about the curriculum their child is following.

Currently, we email all parents with curriculum overviews, prior to the term they are taught, which outline in great detail the curriculum content under each of our Key Questions. Hopefully you will have seen the front cover of Newsletter 41, which shared our curriculum page of the school website which stores all of our Schemes of Work for each subject, in each year group, for each term.



At the start of term we shared with you our 'Meet the Teacher' videos that were recorded onto YouTube, which again will have talked you through the curriculum content of the term.

On reflection, one thing we do not do as a school is routinely provide this for parents who join us mid way through a term, which will now be added to our New Starter procedures. We also recognise that children in our Early Years classes would have had much more detail had we been able to do our 'Welcome Event' in the way we normally would. If there are other ideas that parents have about how you could be better informed, then please let us know.

Considerations from Comments

Things that we are currently discussing at leadership level based on the comments section:

- Whether we need additional opportunities for parent meetings during the year;
- How to better share some of the website subscriptions children can use at home (Purple Mash, TTRS, Mathletics etc.);




