How can we help protect our planet?



### LITERACY

We tried very hard with our explanation texts on animals that are found in the rainforest and have written speeches to explain why we must protect rainforests and our planet against deforestation. In Whole Class Reading, we have been looking at the story of Rain Player. In the story, Pik has to defeat Chac, the god of rain, in the Mayan game 'Pok-a-Tok'.

### MATHS

In maths, we spent several weeks looking at time. We learned about the difference between digital and analogue time, how to write times in both words and numbers, and about 24 hour time. We also worked on the duration of time before recapping work on number, calculations and fractions.



### SCIENCE

In science, we have been looking at light and shadows. We investigated materials and then made our own shadow puppets. We've also been looking at plants and animals that enjoy the dark of the rainforest.

### TOPIC

We have been excited to learn about the Mayans. We learnt about their Gods, what they ate, how they wrote and their number system. We compared their civilisation to our own and found there were lots of similarities. We had a lot of fun designing Mayan masks too!

This term year 4 have continued their investigation into In science we have been looking at sound and how it is Britain's coasts and the features that define a coast. The created. We explored children have also been exploring medieval castles and different instruments replicating their engineering.

#### Maths

Year 4 have been very busy in maths this term, covering topics ranging from reading the time to reading coordinates. We spent a large amount of time learning how to read analogue



and digital clocks, in both the 12 and 24 hour format. We moved onto calculating durations of time and finished with problem solving.

The children have really enjoyed our topic on coordinates and have been very successful. They looked at reading and plotting co-ordinates in the first quadrant before moving onto creating polygons on a grid. The last thing year 4 looked at was how to translate coordinates and shapes on a grid using co-ordinates.

#### Writing

This term year 4 have been on a fantastical adventure, exploring fantasy realms, creatures and plot lines. We started off by creating our own dragons and writing rhyming poems about them. The children loved trying out different vocabulary to create rhyming couplets.



After poetry, the children moved onto writing fantasy narratives that involved terrifying monsters, resilient heroes and evil villains.

Our class reader this term has been Sir Gawain and the

pitched sounds by adapting the types of vibrations.

#### Design and Technology

In DT this term we have been looking at castles and how drawbridges work. The children worked in pairs to design castles, which they decorated. They then used a pulley system to created a drawbridge that could be raised and lowered as needed.



#### Computing

The children learned all about the how packets of information were sent across the internet via switches and servers by running around the play-

ground. We explored IP addresses and how they are used to send information to a specific user.

# Year 6 News

Teachers: Mrs Raines, Miss Bocutt, Mrs Chaudhary, Mrs Anil and Mrs Nielsen

This term we have worked hard to answer the question: 'What is the secret to success?'

#### English

In order to help us answer the question, 'What is the secret to success?' we have been learning about the lives of successful people. We read biographies of: Elvis, Kath-



erine Johnson and Malala in order to find out about the personal qualities they had and how they had overcome any challenges they faced. It was amazing just how many of the High-

wood learning behaviours these inspirational people used! We then researched the lives of people we felt were extraordinary, and wrote their biographies. Finally, we bravely presented these biographies to the class. It was great to be able to use our oracy skills to discuss what we had learnt.

During class reading lessons, we have continued with our book, 'A Wizard of Earthsea'.

#### Maths

We all sighed with relief when we eventually finished the Year 6 maths curriculum. Since then, we have been consolidating our maths knowledge to solve problems.

#### Topic

Over the last few weeks, our topic has focussed on DT, Science, Art and PSHE.

#### Science

We have continued to explore the question, 'What's the secret to a healthy body?' by looking at the effect of exercise on our body and mind, and what is needed for a healthy diet. As scientists, we carried out an experiment to find out the effect of different levels of exercise on our mood and levels of concentration. We were surprised to find out that even though our bodies felt exhausted after the 'beep test', we were more alert and had better levels of concentration. As biologists, we learnt about the 7 different nutrients needed to help us grow and stay healthy, and about the different proportions needed of each of these.

#### Design and Technology



Our design and technology lessons built upon our science learning. We compared different packed lunches before designing, preparing and eating a healthy packed lunch. The children were quite surprised just how tasty the food was, and

many of them loved the healthy option of wholemeal wraps.

#### PSHE

In preparation for moving on to secondary school we have been thinking about what it takes to be awesome! We have used Matthew Syed's book, 'You are Awesome', to explore the difference between a fixed mindset and a growth mindset, and how we need to try new things if we want to be the best versions of ourselves.

#### PE

We have used the learning behaviour of 'teamwork' in PE this term. They have enjoyed playing cricket with Mr Edwards and bench ball and rounders with Miss Bocutt.

#### Art

As textile artists, we experimented with different tie dye techniques before creating our own T -shirts. The bike sheds looked like a festival with all the multicoloured clothes fluttering in the breeze!
