<u>Covid Measures During the Autumn Term -</u> At the end of our first half-term it is great to read a newsletter filled with the fantastic learning opportunities that your children have had and we have managed to restart a few of our normal routines and activities, but with Covid-19 still lurking, we have to **remain cautious**.

I attend a leadership meeting every Tuesday with Wokingham Borough Council and primary and secondary Headteachers and members of the Local Area Health Protection Team. Despite many measures by the government having been completely relaxed, the picture in Wokingham is quite different.

At the time of me writing this email, the local data is as follows:

Cases in Wokingham

A confirmed case is someone who has tested positive for coronavirus.

156 new people had a confirmed positive test result reported on 18 October 2021.

Between 12 October 2021 and 18 October 2021, **1,141** people had a confirmed positive test result. This shows an increase of **34.2%** compared to the previous 7 days.

With a 34% increase in the last 7 days (and with the vast majority of those cases in the 5 - 19 age brackets) we are putting in some proactive measures to keep our Covid-19 caseload to a minimum:

- If there is a positive case in your household, please support us by keeping your child off school
- If there is a positive case, Wokingham are asking us to request you have your children take a <u>PCR test</u> between days 3 to 5 and if negative, you children can return to school
- We will return to virtual assemblies
- We will survey parents about attending our Maths Workshops, if small numbers reply, we can continue this face to face. If there are a large number of parents wanting to attend, we will move this to a virtual meeting.
- We will have a contingency plan in place for our Nativity performance and for our Winter Fair.
- SPLAT WILL NOT TAKE PLACE THIS TERM

Thank you for your continued support in trying to keep our community safe.

Welcome to our first Foundation 1 News this year. We have had a very busy start to the Autumn Term in F1. All the children have settled incredibly well and have begun making friends. 




Settling in


What did pre-historic people yabba dabba do? Reading and Writing

Maths

We have covered a lot in maths this term including counting in 3s, 4s, 8s, 50s and 100s! We have also built on our place value knowledge by working with numbers up to 1000. We have been trying very hard with our column method too!



Science

Our science has also linked with our big question and the Stone Age. We can now sort rocks and soils into groups based on their properties and have tested their strength using different experiments. We have also en-

> joyed looking at different materials and comparing and contrasting Stone Age and modern day cutlery.

Topic

So, what did prehistoric people yabba dabba do? We began to answer this question by plotting some key events on a timeline. It helped some of us to realise that this period of time wasn't during the time of the dinosaurs! We have really enjoyed looking at the geography of Stone Age people too - we recognise the stone blocks in this picture! We know that Stone Henge is located in Salisbury, and we learnt about Avebury and Maiden Castle - all very famous Stone Age sites. We even know about the different way land was used in Stone Age times compared to today!

Welcome to the first newsletter for Year 6. Although we have only been back in school a matter of weeks, we have already achieved a lot. Our topic this term is, 'Does Change Always Lead to Progress?', and we have been thinking about this through English, History and Art.

PHILIP PULLMAN Clockwork or All Wand Up

English

In English, we have been studying a fantastic book, 'Clockwork' by Philip Pullman. It is a gothic fairy story in which invented characters come to life. The story actually has 2 separate plot lines that gradually weave into each

other. Each plot has its own twists and tums, and its own element of suspense. We have thoroughly enjoyed learning the macabre and sinister vocabulary in the story, and are using it to create our own version. We have also started to read 'Cogheart' by Peter Bunzl. This book includes many of the themes we have learnt about in Clockwork.

We have been using our perseverance learning behaviour to read lots of books and complete Accelerated Reader quizzes. Don't forget, the expectation is for 20mins reading every night!

In writing, we have taken the idea of 'inventions' in order to write explanation texts. The children were inspired by

Wallace and Gromit's Cracking Contraptions, to write an explanation of The Snoozatron!



Maths

So far in maths, we have been securing our understanding of place value. We have been learning how to read, write and compare large numbers (up to 10,000,000) and numbers with 3 decimal places. We have been investigating negative numbers and rounding. We have been working hard on improving the speed and accuracy of our arithmetic. We started by solving word and number problems that use our arithmetic skills.

Science

In Science, we have thought about how living things are classified. We have learnt about how to create a classification key, using characteristics of different living organisms.

History/Outdoor Learning

We have been studying the Industrial Revolution and the changes that occurred between 1750 and 1900. So far we have concentrated on looking at population growth, urbanisation and technological changes. We have found out about the process of making cotton and really



enjoyed creating a double-page spread to show our learning.

As a part of our work on the Industrial Revolution, we have been learning about Water Wheels and how they work. We really enjoyed designing and making our own water wheels, especially the part when we got to test them out!

PE

In PE we have been improving our fitness through indoor athletics. We've focussed on the skills of throwing, jumping and sprinting. We may even have some future long-jumpers amongst us!

Art

We have learnt about William Morris and how he was and still is a successful designer from the time of the Industrial Revolution. We have designed our own name labels which we are all very excited to embroider!

What do we do?

A school governing board has three primary duties:

- 1. To set the vision, ethos and strategic direction of the school.
- 2. To hold the head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school.
- 3. To oversee the financial performance and ensure that money is well spent.

We are not involved in the day-to-day management of the school. Operational decision making is performed by the School Leadership Team (SLT) - Head Teacher, Deputy Heads and senior leaders. Instead we are focused purely on the strategic and the longer term. We are all volunteers and are dedicated to making Highwood a great school for pupils, parents, staff and the local community. We have regular meetings every term, each with a specific focus to meeting our objectives:

Resources - To manage finances and school spending

Quality of Education - To review and analyse the school data and curriculum opportunities

Full Governing Board (FGB):

Monitoring the School Development Plan (SDP)

To set and review the whole school's strategy, aspirations and long term goals

What have we done?

The governors have continued to support the school throughout the last academic year:

Continuing to hold FGB and committee meetings virtually

Reading - During the past 18 months we have had regular virtual meetings with Mrs Vaux to discuss reading, writing and the 2 Year Reading Plan

Maths – Working with Miss Majer to understand the Maths Action Plan

Assisting with recruitment by supporting interviews for new staff

What do we plan to do this year?

Mirrors & Windows – This is a standing item on our agenda to monitor opportunities for pupils to inspire and encourage them through role models in their lives and the world around us

Catch up premium – All schools have additional funding to help pupils remain on track due to the Coronavirus impact. Our Resources committee will be monitoring how this is spent.

Parental & Community Engagement – Governors would like to know what you need to support your child's progress at Highwood. We are keen to hear any opportunities for Highwood to benefit from, so please get in touch.

Children in Reception, Years 1 & 2 are entitled to universal free school meals, funded by the government. If your child would like a school dinner please let the class teacher know and this will be booked for them.

Children in Nursery, Years 3 to 6 are required to pay for dinners at a cost of £2.15 per day. Payment should be made via SCOPAY in advance. Dinners are booked in the morning in class when the register is taken and booking closes at 9.30am.

If you think your child may be eligible for benefits related free school meals please contact the school office for a form.

Applicants in receipt of Universal credit must receive a net earned income of less than £7,400 to be entitled to free school meals. This may also entitle your child to other benefits in school i.e. free trips etc.
