Welcome to our Foundation 1 News. We have had a very busy second half of the Autumn Term in F1. We have been continuing to explore our termly topic 'what makes us special?' which has allowed us all to explore ourselves as individuals.

After beginning to explore our senses in the first half of this term, we have continued to learn about the other senses which we use every day-touch, sight, taste and hearing. We learnt all about firework night and the different sounds we might hear and used the torches in the dark to explore light and sight. The children have also been focusing on listening and hearing in phonics where they are learning to distinguish between different sounds they hear with their ears. To explore touch and feel we have been exploring lots of different texture messy plays and sensory trays.





We learnt all about the festival of Diwali where children and adults got to share their experiences of the festival. The children dressed up, explored a Diwali sensory tray, painted Mendi patterns, made lanterns and learnt what Diwali is all about.

During this half of term we have really been focusing on developing the children's attention skills at carpet time. We have been doing this through different carpet time activities. The children have particularly been enjoying story time where they are able to choose stories for us to share as a group.







As part of learning how everyone is different and celebrating diversity, we have really focused on being kind and being a good friend this half of term. This tied in nicely with anti-bullying week where we learnt all about the different ways that we can show kindness to others. We have done lots of circle times focused on the children's Personal, Social and Emotional development and helping them to learn how to deal with different situations.

Welcome to the Foundation Stage Newsletter! It has been such a busy and exciting half term, continuing with our topic question 'Could dinosaurs live in Woodley?', and with all of our other learning—take a look!



We started the term looking at the different ways that dinosaurs move, and we compared animals that we see today who resembled dinosaurs. Our WOW event, a dinosaur day, was very exciting. We baked dinosaur biscuits, and even had a visit from a modern-day dinosaur - a bearded dragon!

In maths the F2 children have been learning about sequencing. They have been using unifix cubes to make a 2 colour repeated pattern and a 3 colour repeating pattern! We introduced numicon and worked together to order them in different ways. Year I News - Autumn 1



As part of our Key Question, we have been looking at the history of the school and of Woodley and the surrounding area. We can explain some of the key ways the school and Woodley has changed and even how we think

they will change in the future! We did lots of activities to explore how Highwood has changed, including making timelines! We have also completed our first DT project, making Christmas biscuits.


We started by researching different types of biscuits to decide what we liked and what we wanted our biscuits

to be like. We then made different designs of Christmas inspired biscuits and evaluated which was our favourite. We have just made our biscuits and cannot wait to eat them at our Christmas party!



Maths

Over the last few weeks we have been focusing on partitioning and finding how many tens and ones are in a number. We have



worked hard on representing numbers in different ways as well as strategies for how to tell which number is greater e.g. look at the tens first. We are continuing to persevere with explaining our thinking

and are having a go at doing this independently.

English

This term we have been looking at traditional tales, focusing on 'The Three Little Pigs.' We loved reading the story and identifying all of the key phrases we would need to use. We have practised retelling the story a lot, both orally and through some drama! The children have written their own versions of The Three Little Pigs, choosing their own animals and the type of material to build the houses from. We were very impressed by their creativity and the way they challenged themselves with their word choice to think of the most interesting

adjectives possible. We also discovered some amazing acting skills with the children thinking hard about their expression and actions to tell the story.


Year 3 News




Topic

Year 4 News



Welcome to the second edition of the Year 4 news! All the Year 4 children have continued to take pride in their learning and have produced some amazing work. Please read on to find out about the incredible learning the children have been doing!

What is More Precious - water or gold?

Year 4 continued our investigation into the Ancient As scientists we have been looking at Egyptians and how their wealth and the river Nile were the digestive system. The children beimportant to their rise to power success as a civilisation. came the food and acted out how the

We learned all about why the River Nile was so important to the Egyptians, explored an Egyptian textile Khayamiya and have created their own hieroglyphic counting system.



Maths

In maths this term the children explored and concreted their understanding of mental methods of multiplication and learnt how to multiply 1 digit numbers by 3 digit numbers using the grid and formal methods. The children have explored addition and subtraction of 4 digit numbers and have been challenged to multiple exchanges within one calculation. We continued our work on addition and subtraction to find answers to multistep problems. The children have also revisited Mummification! rounding from Autumn Term 1 to help us estimate answers.

We have been consolidating our times table knowledge and this has been improving each week, but any extra practise that could be squeezed in on the school run or at home would be beneficial!

English

In our writing, we have created excellent setting descriptions, full of adjectives, powerful verbs, descriptive senses and an assortment of fronted adverbial phrases. In the last week of term we are going to pull all of this together and write a whole narrative all about a child becoming brave and adventuring into a task they are scared to do! We are so excited to read the outcome!

Year 4 have continued reading 'Secrets of a Sun King' and the class have loved the excitement and adventure within the story. We have been improving our APE (answer it, prove it, explain it) answers when exploring new vocabulary to find out what the unfamiliar words mean.

Science

food travels through our body and performed the function of each organ. We also looked at what different teeth we have and the function of each one. The children then became dentists and designed the 'perfect' set of teeth out of home made play-doh!





As artists we have looked at the Egyptian textile Khayamiya. The elaborate pattern was originally used to decorate inside tents but over the years have changed their function towards cushions covers

and fashion. The children created their own unique designs based on this influence!

We have learned all about how Pharaohs were mummified in Ancient Egypt. The children were disgusted and fascinated to learn that the Pharaoh's brain would be taken out by a hook through the nose! We then became embalmers and mummified our own tomato Pharaohs. We scooped out the organs then filled them with salt leaving them to dry out.

Year 6 News

Looking back over this Autumn Term, we can't believe how much we have learnt and done. We have continued to address our question 'Does Change Always Lead to Progress?' through English, History, Science and the Arts. Year 6 would like to wish a Happy Christmas to all our families and friends.

English

We are thoroughly enjoying our whole class reading book 'Cogheart' by Peter Bunzl. It is an exciting adventure story that includes themes such as: what it means to be human; trust and betrayal; friendship and kindness.



In writing, we have used our knowledge of the Industrial Revolution to write biographies about influential men and women of the time, how their lives contributed to their successes, and how we benefit from their legacies today.

After half-term we immersed ourselves in poetry. We read and performed a variety of poems, and collected our favourite ones in our own anthology. We then wrote our own poems inspired by Robert MacFarland's Red Fox.

Maths

We have continued to hone our arithmetic skills and use them to solve mathematical problems. We loved learning about the order of operations, and were able to use BODMAS to solve number problems. In the second half of this term, we have investigated shape. We learnt the properties of 2D shapes and used this knowledge to find missing angles; we have explored 3D shapes and their nets.

Science

In Science, we started off finding out about Darwin and how he developed his theory of evolution. We investigated how the different beaks of finches had adapted over many gener-



ations so that they were better able to survive on the food that grew on different islands of the Galapagos. We also studied the peppered moth, and how it adapted to the environmental changes of the industrial revolution.

Recently, we have begun to build on our knowledge and

understanding of electricity. We have learned the scientific symbols for electrical components, and how these can be combined to make a circuit.



<u>Art</u>

As artists we have completed 2 very different projects: peppered moths and an embroidered name label. We

applied the skills of sketching and our knowledge of creating tone and texture to create our own peppered moths.



We put all our moths together to produce a combined

display that shows the variation in the patterns of the moth and how it has evolved. For the name label, we studied the work of William Morris before designing and embroidering our own name labels.

History

As historians, we studied the impact that railways had on the people of Britain. And asked, whether they were a change for good or bad? We then looked at the development of the Great Western Railway and how Reading Station had changed over time.

PE

In PE with Mr Edwards, we have been learning about fitness and how important it is to exercise as well as learning how to coach others in ball skills. In gymnastics, we used teamwork to create a synchronised sequence using balances, jumps and travelling.


