Dear Parents/Carers,

There is always a funny feeling after having an OFSTED inspection, as the length of time between the leadership team knowing the judgement and being able to share the outcome can often take the shine off the achievement.

In order to keep the momentum of school improvement going, we are broadening our focus to start developing the outside area of our school, so that it can provide as many learning opportunities as the inside of our building.

The projects being explored are as follows:

• Developing an outside area for The Orchard (our Speech and Language Resource). This would be attached to the 'The Orchard' at the front of the school near the main reception. The designs could include the following ideas:





- We want to increase the tarmacked area between the Key Stage 1 and 2 playgrounds so that there is more space for children to play, particularly when the field is not in use.
- We are also having a purpose built wildlife area designed with a school pond, science trail and outdoor classroom. This would be positioned on the back field of the school and could look something like this:



One project inside the building we are exploring is the relocating of our main school library, so that it is a
focal point of the school. It would be a purpose built space and offer our children a much more enriched
library experience.



English

To help us understand more about different countries and cultures, we have main focus this half studied various traditional tales from around the world. We looked at other versions of Cinderella in great detail and develop different then used our knowledge to write our own versions of The Korean Cinderella.

Whale Class Reading

We have been reading 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy. The children gave such insightful opinions



How has water shaped our World?

English

Maths

Year 3 have had an exciting start of term, imagining that they are Mr Mole and writing a diary entry about the day that they ventured into the Wild Wood - scary stuff! We have also enjoyed rewriting our own tale for Toad and spent a long time thinking about how to use sentences effectively, and speech, in our writing.



Whole Class Reading

We read the classic text 'The Wind in the Willows' this term and the children could see the differences between each of the character's personalities. There is so much wonderful vocabulary in this book! All of this helped hugely in our writing in English. We are also reading 'The River Singers', which is similar to 'The Wind in the Willows' in using animals as central characters. We have met a family of voles, who need to shelter constantly from the dangers that the area around the river can bring.

The children have been working hard on proportional representation and understand that an image can be used to represent many units. This has helped us with mental multiplication and division calculations. Year 3 have also been looking at fractions and have been working very hard to understand the quite difficult concepts, such as equivalence. Well done for your great perseverance!

Topic

We started off our new key question gathering information on the different ways in which water is used daily and worldwide. The children were surprised to see how much of an impact water has on our lives. We learnt about boats through history, and then got to see waterways in our local area too. We are big fans of Henley and the River and Rowing Museum!

What did the Romans Do For Us?

English

This term we have been focussing on Roman Myths. We created our own myths using 'The Man who Cut Down Trees' as our inspiration. This allowed the children to develop stories that told a moral, whilst adding in a fair amount of humour and mischievous behaviour from the gods. After this we developed the myth into playscripts, including dialogue and stage direction, before putting on performances for other members of the class.

Maths

This term we started with learning the concepts behind division. The children explored how division worked using practical equip-



ment, before moving onto using a variety of different written methods. The children were particularly fond of the part whole model and were able to use them to divide three digit numbers by one digit number, even solving problems involving remainders.

In the second half of the term we have been learning all about 2D shapes. We explored types of angles, triangles, quadrilaterals and a variety of other 2D shapes.

History

With our key question being all about the Romans, the children have been focussing a lot on History this term so far. We have explored who the



Romans were, looking at their armies, gods, leisure activities and artefacts. The children were equal parts

fascinated and horrified to learn all about how the Romans bathed themselves!

Geography

Year 4 have been using digital devices to explore the world the Romans inhabited.



We learned how to find a site suitable for starting new settlements and had a go at identifying one on a map.

Science

This term we have been learning states of matter, ex-

ploring the differences between solids, liquids and gases.

Art

The children have been learning all about Roman mosaics this term and have

created designs to make their own after the half term break. We explored the work of Gaudi to draw inspiration for our plans.

Music

The children have been lucky enough to have Kevin from Berkshire Maestros come in



and teach them how to play the cornet and everyone has been trying really hard to play this tricky instrument - easy to use but hard to master! The pupils have been doing very well and are making some "interesting" music!

Is Invasion Ever Justified?

Welcome to the first spring edition of the Year 5 news! I am pleased to say that we've had lots of exciting opportunities and lots of new learning going on. Please read on to find out more!

English

All our English this term has been around the story of Beowulf, the Anglo Saxon hero who saved a town from the perilous death that Grendel was spreading! We've spent a long time analysing the text and collecting crucial vocabulary. After this, we created our own, vile monsters for Beowulf to defeat, using character descriptions to create wanted posters for the town of Heorot. During the final week of term, we've been writing our own Beowulf saga using these creatures too!



Maths

Our focus in maths this term has been fractions. the differ Throughout the term, we have looked at equivabout how alent fractions, converting mixed/improper fractions, as well as ordering and comparing fractions with different denominators. It has been a

tricky process for us, but by using our times tables and division facts to find equivalent fractions to help us along our journey.

Key Question Lessons

Our key question for this term is 'Is Invasion Ever Justified?', where we are basing our learn-

ing all around The Vikings and The Anglo-Saxons. To kick off our topic, we started by completing our very own archaeological dig where we dug for Anglo Saxon artefacts and asked historical questions to try and learn more about the civ-



ilisations. Through the topic, we have also looked at what physical and human geography features might come into play when deciding on why you would invade a country, learnt about the different Anglo-Saxon kings and learnt about how the country was split into seven key kinadoms.

It has been a super start to the year. We look forward to continuing this hard work after half term

Year 6 News

The term we have really immersed ourselves in our topic question, 'What would a world without war look like?' So far we have concentrated on the causes of WW2 and the effect of the war on Britain - The Home Front.

English



In whole class reading we studied 'When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit'. We learnt so much about the rise of Hitler and the Nazi party through the eyes of Anna and her family. We enjoyed the humour in the book, and it provoked many debates such as whether Switzerland should have stayed neutral during WW2.

In writing, we wrote a powerful description about The Blitz. We used lots of the figurative language (personification, similes etc) that we had learnt about in the Autumn Term. After that, we wrote a story from the point of view of an evacuee. We were able to include plenty of historical detail from our history lessons.



Maths

This term we have been learning about fractions: finding equivalents, converting between mixed numbers and improper fractions, converting between decimals, fractions and percentages. We then learnt how to calculate with fractions. Arithmetic has also been a focus. We are excited to see our arithmetic scores improve each week!

Topic

Over the last few weeks, our topic has focussed on art, history and science.

History

History has been the main focus of our topic this term. We have learnt about the women's land army (and the role of women in WW2) and we wrote a letter to a young woman trying to persuade





her to come and work at our farm. We found out about evacuees and how they were different from refugees. We were amazed about rationing and what people actually ate in the war. Perhaps our question should have been, 'How could people live in a world without pizza or McDonalds!?.

More recently we have learnt about the music people used to dance to.

Art

As artists, we evaluated WW2 propaganda posters. How successful were they at conveying their message? What makes a propaganda poster visually appealing. We then designed our own, and we are looking forward to creating them.



Science

We have been investigating light in Science and thinking about how the properties of light were used for attack and defence during WW2. We know you need to have light in order to see and that the blackout prevented German bombers from identifying targets.

PE

In PE, the children have been learning racket skills. This has involved tennis with Mr Edwards and badminton with Miss Bocutt and Mrs Raines.

SCHOOL UNIFORM



All uniform orders must be made and paid for via SCOPAY. Please contact the school office if you do not have a login.

We sell logoed jumpers/cardigans, PE tops, Book bags and PE bags.

Once ready the uniform will then be sent to your child's class or can be collected from the School office.

SCHOOL DINNERS

Children in Reception, Years 1 & 2 are entitled to universal free school meals, funded by the government. If your child would like a school dinner please let the class teacher know and this will be booked for them.

Children in Nursery, Years 3 to 6 are required to pay for dinners at a cost of £2.15 per day. Payment should be made via SCOPAY in advance. Dinners are booked in the morning in class when the register is taken and booking closes at 9.30am.



If you think your child may be eligible for benefits related free school meals please contact the school office for a form.

Applicants in receipt of Universal credit must receive a net earned income of less than £7,400 to be entitled to free school meals. This may also entitle your child to other benefits in school i.e. free trips etc.
