Dear Parents/Carers,

Covid Update:

This term has been packed with a lot more of the school based events that have been missing during the pandemic. We are continuing to proceed with caution, as there are still a small number of cases across the school and the impact on staffing is still a daily challenge. After Easter, we will continue to introduce more of the traditional events that take place during Summer, and once these dates have been confirmed, we will share them with you through the weekly bulletins.

The vast majority of guidance that schools have had to follow has been withdrawn from the government websites. The information below lets you know what is still currently in place:

- Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education or childcare setting.
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high
 temperature should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can go back to education or childcare setting when
 they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.
- Any staff who have a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home for 5 days after the day they took the test.
- Children and young people who usually attend an education or childcare setting and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.



I hope this helps to make sure everyone is clear about the procedures that will still be in place despite much of the guidance being removed.



School Library:

We have had the first sets of designs for our school library sent through from one of the companies providing quotes. We plan to send feedback to them based on a few adaptations we would like to make, but it is very exciting seeing what additional provision we could have here at Highwood and how we can utilise different spaces to continue our focus on reading across the school.

It was really useful and pleasing to attend this Governor Day, fairly soon after our recent "Good" Ofsted report.

I came away with the feeling that our children are engaged with the lessons and this was evident by how many children, across all classes, were eager to put their hand up and contribute by attempting to answer the teacher's questions.

The classroom displays were eye-catching and informative, and even little touches such as the desk stands in Y4 which give a guide on how to write informatively (A.P.E.: Answer/Prove/Explain) were great to see.

Children learning about Christopher Columbus and during questioning they showed a good knowledge of other explorers. They were able to link prior learning and all pupils were willing to answer questions. Classrooms were calm and children were well behaved and engaged.

The Computing lesson with the Kubo robots was really exciting. I enjoyed seeing the children working in teams to learn about the basics of programming using simple commands and loops, and guide the little robot from one location to another.

There is a great atmosphere in school and clear evidence of the key questions and learning which has taken place around school.


Foundation 1 News Miss Nunn




The children have been very engaged with learning all about how plants grow. We looked at a time-lapse of a sunflower



English


Maths

Year 3 have been working incredibly hard on their biography writing and have showcased three important women who have careers that centre around water: surfer Layne Beachley, snowboarder Kelly Clarke, and sailor Dame Ellen MacArthur. We learnt about the lives and achievements of these inspirational women and created a brilliant class book of biographies.

We have been working hard in maths looking at measure. This has involved looking at money, revisiting which coins have which values and finding change. We have moved on to looking at measuring distances, and have started to think about the perimeter being used to measure the distance around 2D shapes.


Topic

We heard that the tune was in waltz time, and then listened to the Blue Danube by Strauss and discovered this was in the same timing! We thought that the music sounded like birds bobbing down the water.

Maths

Key Question Lessons

Our key question for this term is 'Is Invasion Ever Justified?', where we are basing our learning all around The Vikings and The Anglo-Saxons. To kick off our topic, we started by

exploring Anglo Saxon artefacts and asked historical questions to try and learn more about the civilisation. Through the topic, we have also looked at what physical and human geography features might come into play when deciding on why you would invade a country and learnt about how the country was split into six

Year 6 News

This term has been a busy one with lots of hard work but also lots of fun. We have continued to address our key question, 'What would a world without war look like?'

English



Our whole class reading book this half term has been, 'When the Sky Falls' by Phil Earle. The children have enjoyed getting to know Joseph (a troubled boy who has been evacuated to the city), and how he learns to understand his own feelings through his relationship with a gorilla (Adonis). We used this book to in-

spire our writing of a newspaper report about an incident when Adonis protected Joseph against the school bullies. We are now learning how to present one side of a balanced argument: "We should never go to war" in order to address the United Nations in a debate. The children are drawing upon the knowledge from history lessons and from current world events.

Maths

In maths, we have continued to focus on arithmetic and have enjoyed using SumDog to support us with this. We have also learnt about ratio and proportion; area, perimeter and volume of shapes; plot coordinates on all four quadrants.

Topic

Over the last few weeks, our topic has focussed on art, history, geography and music.

Art

As artists, we evaluated the work of a variety of war artists (William F Draper, Laura Knight, Paul Nash, Edward Ardizonne). We also used our understanding of propaganda to design and create positive and negative prints.



History and Geography

The children have continued to show a real enthusiasm for learning about WW2. In Geography, we looked at Reading and compared it to Dusseldorf (the city in Germany that Reading is twinned with), to see how WW2 affected both places. In History, we started by finding out about different key battles: The Evacuation of Dunkirk and the Battle of Britain. We also learnt about what it was like to be a young person in Germany in the 1930s under Nazism. Finally, we had a wonderful day pretending to be evacuees. The children learnt so much from

pretending to be on a train, sharing experiences of other evacuees and playing games that children would have played during the war. They were all surprised that you could have fun without technology!

We have enjoyed playing Boccia and New Age Kurling during our indoor PE lessons. The children have used teamwork to out-play each other. With Mr Edwards, the children have taken part in fitness challenges and have enjoyed a spot of golf!

SCHOOL UNIFORM



All uniform orders must be made and paid for via SCOPAY. Please contact the school office if you do not have a login.

We sell logoed jumpers/cardigans, PE tops, Book bags and PE bags.

Once ready the uniform will then be sent to your child's class or can be collected from the School office.

SCHOOL DINNERS

Children in Reception, Years 1 & 2 are entitled to universal free school meals, funded by the government. If your child would like a school dinner please let the class teacher know and this will be booked for them.

Children in Nursery, Years 3 to 6 are required to pay for dinners at a cost of £2.15 per day. Payment should be made via SCOPAY in advance. Dinners are booked in the morning in class when the register is taken and booking closes at 9.30am.



If you think your child may be eligible for benefits related free school meals please contact the school office for a form.

Applicants in receipt of Universal credit must receive a net earned income of less than £7,400 to be entitled to free school meals. This may also entitle your child to other benefits in school i.e. free trips etc.

Please note that our school policy is for earrings to be removed for PE, for the health and safety of the children.

It is recommended that ear piercing is only done in the first week of the summer holidays to allow the time for them to settle.
