Geography

Locations



Key Vocabulary

Chronological (History) - a record of events put in the order of when they happened

Countries (Geography) - a land lived in by people with the same government.

Capital city (Geography) - the area where the government of that country works.

Human features (Geography) - ways in which humans have made changes to the land, e.g. a bridge, a castle.

Physical features (Geography) - natural formations or parts of the Earth's surface, e.g. a mountain, a river, cliffs.

Organs (Science) - A group of things inside the body that help it to work. Eg. Heart and lungs.

Habitats (Science) - A natural place where animals live

Climate (Science) - the weather over a long period of time. Eg. How hot it is, how much it rains or how cold it is.
