'Where Individuals Matter'

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to our Summer edition of the newsletter. This term has flown by with a huge amount of activity in the classrooms and behind the scenes.

The first half of the Summer Term is always a challenge as we juggle the end of year assessments whilst making sure our children get a full and varied curriculum. As you read through the newsletter, hopefully you will see that we achieved both!

Our Year 6 and Year 2 children have been fantastic in their attitudes towards the end of Key Stage tests. They have all tried their very best and that is all we ever ask of them. They're now all done and finished so we move on to a greater feeling of normality.

Our EYFS team had an extremely successful Local Authority moderation. Every 4 years or so, schools are chosen to be moderated and the Local Authority colleagues spend two mornings in school (one for pre-assessment and one assessment day). They were extremely pleased with what they saw - they commented on how well our staff knew your children and how many or our writers may have the chance to reach the 'Exceeding' standard rather than the 'Expected' standard. Our predictions are, once again, likely to be well above the National Average.

Alongside all the opportunities your children have had this term, we have successfully put our Post OFSTED Action Plan into action. This includes:

- A new Writing cycle;
- A new Maths cycle;
- Restructuring of our Pupil Progress Meetings;
- Investment in new assessment resources;
- A review of senior roles and responsibilities;
- Organising INSET days on Maths (24th July) and Writing (4th January) to help develop teaching and learning in the classroom;
- Organising a Peer Review with two Headteacher Colleagues from my Primary Learning Network to help evaluate the impact of our actions so far.

These refinements will help strengthen our ability to make sure every child makes progress and that our strong attainment profile in EYFS and Key Stage 1 is replicated in Key Stage 2. Thank you for all your support during this process - knowing that our parents are supportive for the work we do has really been a key factor in keeping staff morale high.

Enjoy reading the class updates from this term, and I wish you all a restful half-term break.

Foundation 1 News



'Why do animals live in different places?'

Foundation welcomed our last group of children for the year. They have been settling in well and the other children have been helping them to get to know the daily routines. The children have been enjoying the recent good weather and have been exploring the garden more. The children have enjoyed lots of water play outside and using the guttering to channel water.

To start our topic off we started with an under the sea adventure. We have enjoyed playing in our Pirate ship role play area and our Beach shop outside. We have learnt some pirate songs and some new counting songs about sea creatures. We also used some different sized sea creatures to remind ourselves about how to describe the size of things and we tried to order them according to their size.





We have spent time looking at the 'Rainbow Fish'. We're getting very good at remembering the events that happen in a story and getting them in the right order. The children also enjoyed acting out the story using puppets. After getting to know the story we thought about what makes a good friend and how to share resources with each other. We have looked at what the sea is like and all of the wonderful animals that you find in it. The children were fascinated to learn about the different depths of the ocean and what the fish are like who live there.

We have been learning about alliteration in phonics. The children have been practising to listen carefully to the first sound in words before thinking of other things that begin with the same sound. We have had fun making up silly alliterative sentences too.





We are now learning about minibeasts. At

first we thought of all of the different ones we know and where they might be found. We have enjoyed solving clues to work out which minibeast is being described. We have started to enjoy some stories about different minibeasts including the Bad Tempered Ladybird and Superworm. The children have enjoyed having a minibeast hunt in the garden which lead us to discuss how to handle them carefully.

Mrs Galpin has been back this term to complete a fun filled activity using the parachute. Mrs Galpin told us the story of Naoh's Ark using props. We thought about the different sounds that animals make and where they may live. The children showed very good listening skills and enjoyed using the Noah small world set back in the classroom. 






In maths the children have been doing maths investigations, using maths in real life. We have also learnt about money, days of the week, time and measure.



develop their vocabulary and use words such as 'longer' and 'shorter'. We then experimented with water to learn about capacity and volume, before designing our own


> tropical 'mocktails' using words such as 'full' and 'empty'!



'Why did people build Stonehenge?'

LITERACY

In literacy this term we have been looking at fairy-tales. We have read and re-told tales as well as looking at fairy tales from another character's point of view. We have written out



own versions of classic fairy tales and finished off by creating our very own story.

In guided reading we have been looking at the story of 'Hansel and Gretel' by Anthony Brown. The children have been interpreting



and spotting patterns in the pictures and exploring the new vocabulary we come across.

MATHS

In maths we have been exploring the properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes including the different sorts of triangles. We also looked at representing data



using pictograms and bar charts.
We have now started looking at telling the time on an

analogue clock to 5 minutes. We are



also trying to learn which months have how many days. So please keep practising.

SCIENCE

In science we have been looking at rocks and soil. We have learnt all about the different sorts of rocks and how they are formed. Then we learnt about where fossils come from and the amazing discoveries of Mary Anning. Finally we looked at the differences in soil to help us pot up our sunflowers from last term.

TOPIC

We began our new topic of 'Why did people build Stonehenge?' We have learnt about life in the Stone Age as



well as how people might have moved the rocks to Stonehenge.

Year 4 News Summer 1 Mr Allaway and Mrs Tindall

'Why would someone build a castle here?'

Welcome to the Summer 1 edition of the Year 4 news! We have had lots of cross curricular fun, with Castles and 'Sir Gawain and the Green Knight' novel.

English - Discussion Text

This term year 4 have been learning how to write discussion texts. We started by debating topics such as, 'should children be allowed to keep pets?' and 'are computer games good for you?' These helped the children to think about an argument from both



sides and not just from their own opinion.

We then learned how to add coordinating conjunctions and subordinating conjunctions using the acronyms FANBOYS and I SAW A WABUB. In addition to this, we looked at using connectives to link two different sentences together. As a class we linked the shared writing to our guided reading text, 'Sir Gawain and the Green Knight',

discussing whether he should be courageous and set off on his quest, or take the smart option and stay at home!

Maths - Statistics and time

In maths year 4 have been learning about continuous and discrete data, and different ways to represent it. The children used bar graphs, frequency graphs and line graphs to represent different data, and then examined it to understand what information they could gather from it. In their final activity, the children were

able to help Sudeley Castle to understand which attractions to keep open, what time to close the bridge to the adventure playground and which age group visited most often.

All of the children have been working hard to understand how to read analogue and digital time, both in 12 and



24 hour clocks. They are now able to convert time between the difference clocks.

As part of our time unit, the children created sundials in playground using chalk and PE equipment. Although the afternoon cloud cover stopped them completing the dials, they were able to get a good understanding of how the sun moves and how to estimate the time from

History - The beginning of Norman Britain

In history, year 4 learned all about the Battle of Hastings. They explored who took part, what happened and why it occurred. They created cartoon strips depicting the battle and the eventual demise of King

Geography - Settlements

Year 4 have done a lot of work this term on early set-

tlements and why people chose to settle in certain areas. We used google maps to explore different castles and looked at the features of the surrounding landscape. The children



were then able to explain which sites were best for settling and what the limitations were of each.

Science - States of matter.

In science, the children have been learning about different states of matter. They have learned how everything is made of molecules and how the molecules behave

differently in solids, liquids and gases. Next half term, we will be looking at how to change the state of matter of different objects.

'Are Heroes and Villains so different?'

Literacy - Myths and Legends

Our topic is focussing on Heroes and Villains but with a Greek slant. We have been reading Greek Myths and we have been writing to entertain, with a big PE emphasis on the reader and how we can plan to make our myths exciting. We read 'Prometheus and Pandora', we investigated how an author creates empathy with the characters, as well as building in the structure of our writing through use of paragraphing and looking at ways to improve our writing grammatically. We have

used the Ancient Greek texts to help us to develop our ideas. We have been enjoying the myths and in particular 'Theseus and The Minotaur.'



We are currently reading

'Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief' as our book study which brings in many of the characters we have been associating with this term.

Maths

In maths we have been learning division, which we have later developed to solve division problems. We have been using lots of tools to help us and investigating different methods before deciding on which ones we prefer. Some have been through investigation and others showing our 1855 steps and workings, then explaining why we chose to solve the problem in that way. Sometimes it is ok to



show our workings, but the challenge comes when you have to convince others why arriving at that particular answer is the case.

Science

During science we have been learning about lifecycles, comparing them and what makes each lifecycle unique. We have been learning about plant reproduction, how

plants reproduce and the parts required, how seeds can be transported, as well as looking at real plants through dissection.

This term we have been improving our racquet skills with a difference. Badminton gives the children a chance to improve their eye to ball skills but with a



shuttle. They have really enjoyed playing this sport, some not having experienced it before outside of a club.

We have been further developing their batting, catching and fielding skills in 'Rounders'. The weather has also been on our side and the children have enjoyed being able to try out all of the disciplines, as well as having that competitive edge to win.

Mr Edwards has been preparing the children for Sports day by improving their skills and fitness levels in running, jumping, throwing and bringing in a bit of maths through measuring.

In Music

We have been learning to appraise and appreciate different styles of modern music. We learnt to sing and use percussion with 'The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air' and 'Living on a prayer.'

In Art we have been creating our own mythical characters, using paint as a discipline. We will be using some of these ideas for our Greek pots next half term.

Feel free to pop in to see what we have been learning, there has been some fabulous art work, story writing and work about the Greeks, where Greece is in relation to the UK, what the climate is like, the types of food eaten as well as making the comparisons of Ancient Greece to that of today.


Currently, with the "excitement" of SATs now behind us, they are busy planning a narrative piece about a lighthouse keeper and how a whole town

Science


Literacy—What Makes a Hero?







As you will have seen from see-saw, the children have been very busy in KS1 and KS2 Resource literacy lessons with the focus on 'Traction Man is Here' by Mini Grey. We have written character descriptions, story settings, thought and speech bubbles and re-told the story using powerful words and fronted adverbials (our favourites included 'in the blink of an eye' and 'quick as a flash'). We are finishing the project with the children's own stories of 'Traction Man goes to Highwood', bringing together everything we have learned. Next half term we will be interviewing real life and unsung heroes. Do you know anyone who fits this description who could come and tell us about how they help other people?



KS1 resource have made a great start with Times Tables Rock Stars this half term, starting with the 2x and 10X tables. They have also been using arrays to work out times tables, showing that doubles are the same as multiplying by 2 and working out division facts from multiplication facts. Well done to those who have already worked at home on TTRS and Mathletics!

Maple Maths

This half of term has really flown by! The children have worked really hard to improve their times tables recall speeds and "Times Tables Rock Stars" has been a real motivator. If your child hasn't shown you at home then ask them about it!

We've also had our Yr6 children completing their SATs tests. They've all worked so hard over the year and whatever their results, they should be really proud of themselves.

One of the more tricky areas of Maths seems to be Time, so if you have any chances to practice with your child over the half term, it would make a huge difference to their confidence.
