Attendance



School success starts with attendance

I updated you last term with our concerns around Attendance, in particular our Persistent Absenteeism. Last academic year, the National Averages for attendance was <u>95.4%</u> and the Persistent Absenteeism was 12.1%.

In our December Newsletter, our attendance percentage was <u>92.8%</u> and <u>Persistent Absenteeism level was 22.8%</u>. Our year to date figures have since improved and our attendance figure is at <u>93.5%</u> with our <u>Persistent Absenteeism rate is now 20.7%</u>

Thank you for your continued help and support in improving these attendance figures, it is very much appreciated.

Academisation Update

Our academistation application has been submitted and we are on the agenda for the Regional Advisory Board on February 23rd. As soon as I have any further updates I will let you know. Fingers crossed that the next stage of the process can begin.

Library Update:

Here is a sneaky peak of part of the wall wrap that will be installed in the library during half term. The children have been heavily involved in the design features, book choices and feedback process. We were on version 5 by the time I approved the final design, so I am confident it will look great! Hopefully the children will be as excited as the adults to visit the new library after half term.

We have also appointed a school librarian that will be in the library during all the timetabled sessions to help support children choosing books they will enjoy.

Welcome to our Foundation 1 News. We have had a very busy first half of the Spring Term in F1. We have begun exploring our new topic which is 'Why do things change?' and have welcomed a new group of F1 children into the setting. We've been really impressed with how quickly they've settled and how helpful the older children have been.

We started this term learning about the different seasons of the year. We were blessed with a cold snap and had fun playing with ice we found in the garden. The children were very good at telling us what would happen in Winter - Santa, making snowmen and having to wrap up warm. When we moved on to Spring, the children made some beautiful Spring crafts and learnt to sing a Spring song called, "It's Springtime." We made butterflies and finger-painted Spring trees with blossom or fresh, green leaves. We used our observation skills to find signs of Spring - we saw buds on the trees and saw daffodils emerging.











The children have also been developing their listening, attention and teamwork skills during P.E. They especially enjoyed "Run Rabbit Run" and stealing the foxes' tails in "catch the tail". These types of activities enable the children to learn how to follow instructions and work together in order to play the game. During P.E, we have also been learning to move in different ways and exploring the different ways our bodies can move.







During this half of term we also celebrated Chinese New Year. It was lovely that we have a child in the class that actually celebrates this festival so they were able to share their experiences and their mummy very kindly made Chinese dumplings for us to taste. They were so yummy! We made drums to scare away Nian, made Chinese dragons and red lanterns, role played in our Chinese restaurant and enjoyed lots of "lucky" red and gold messy play.

In phonics this half term, we've looked at rhyming. The children have all loved the rhyming books and always enjoy a favourite nursery rhyme. We've been thinking about how rhyming words sound the same at the end and also the shape your mouth makes is also the same. We have also been thinking about simple sentences when we've played our "jumping sentence" game. We look at an action card and then jump the number of words in the sentence we create e.g. "She is hopping" or "The boy is sleeping."

Science



We have been exploring what things are made of this term, looking at many different materials and where these are found. The children have

been very creative in their ideas and really thought outside of the box.

History and Art



As part of our Key
Question, we have been
looking at the history of
the toys and how they
have developed over time.
We can explain some of

the key differences between the toys of the past and the toys we have at home we enjoyed being able to look at old toys and thought about which ones we would have liked to have. We have looked more

specifically at the history of LEGO and considered how and why it changed to become what it is today. In art, we have been so excited to begin painting. We have practised colour mixing, using our primary

colours to make
secondary colours, as well as
using white and black to help us
explore tone and how this changes
a painting. We have tried painting
a toy and are going to evaluate how we
can improve our paintings after halfterm.



This term, we have revisited place value, addition and subtraction by looking at our numbers to 20. We have thought about how numbers can be split into tens and ones and how we can use



our number-bond knowledge to help us find the answer. We have also practised building our own number lines and have begun to estimate.

English and Music



Our story focus this term was 'The Nutcracker'. We found this story fascinating and loved creating our own version of 'the Land of Sweets' The children have impressed us with the way they have

challenged themselves to improve their writing and have carefully considered the best adjectives to use. We have also explored how 'The Nutcracker' was created to be a ballet in our music. We have carefully considered the different songs (our favourite was The Russian Dance) and have even tried some of the dance moves as well.



How has water shaped our World?

English

Year 3 have had an exciting start of term, imagining that they are Mr Mole and writing a diary entry about the day that they ventured into the Wild Wood - scary stuff! We have also enjoyed rewriting our own tale for Toad and spent a long time thinking about how to use sentences effectively, and speech, in our writing.



Whole Class Reading

We read the classic text 'The Wind in the Willows' this term and the children could see the differences between each of the character's personalities. There is so much wonderful vocabulary in this book! All of this helped hugely in our writing in English. We are also reading 'The River Singers', which is similar to 'The Wind in the Willows' in using animals as central characters. We have met a family of voles, who need to shelter constantly from the dangers that the area around the river can bring.

Maths

The children have been working hard on multiplication. We have realised the relationship between multiplying a digit by one, and by ten, and have made links between multiplying between two, four and eight. We have worked on multiplying a two digit number by a one digit number as well. Well done for such great perseverance!

Topic

We started off our new key question gathering information on the different ways in which water is used daily and worldwide. The children were surprised to see how much of an impact water has on our lives. We learnt about boats through history, and then learnt about the waterways in our local area too. We are big fans of Henley now, as well as the River Thames!

What did the Romans Do For Us?



English

This term we have been focussing on Roman Myths. We created our own introduction to a myth using 'The Man who Cut Down Trees' as our inspiration. This allowed the children to develop plot and tension that began the dilemma of a moral, whilst adding pathetic fallacy to show the Gods emotions. After this we delved into playscripts, including dialogue and stage directions, before putting on performances for other members of the class.

Maths

This term we started with learning the concepts behind multiplication and division. The children have explored these by using practical equipment, before moving onto using a variety of different written methods. In Multiplication, we started with the grid method and most children progressed to using the compact column method to answer 3-digit by 1-digit questions. In Division, the children all used the place value method and some have used the part-whole model. They were able to use them to divide three digit numbers by one digit number, even solving problems involving remainders.

History

With our key question being all about the Romans, the children have been focusing a lot on History this term so far. We have explored what the Roman Empire was, their armies, gods and artefacts. We had lots of fun recreating Roman battle formations with our shields. The children then used their shields to recreate and act

out the Roman timeline with key events that took place. We have been extremely impressed that they can remember when Rome was built and when the empire collapsed.

Science

This term we have been learning about food chains. The children created their own food chain in a Russian Doll



style where the predator can eat its prey. We have also begun looking into states of matter, exploring the

differences between solids, liquids and gases.

Art and DT

In Art and DT this term we have started to look at mosaics. We've appreciated Antoni Gaudi's work



with mosaics and how this is linked to the Romans. We have also thought about Roman mosaics and how they inspire us!

A P

Computing

The children have had a lot of fun learning about loop commands in computing. They were able to program a robot to remember and repeat

a loop command on its own. They loved it!


Is Invasion Ever Justified?

Welcome to the first spring edition of the Year 5 news! I am pleased to say that we've had lots of exciting opportunities and lots of new learning going on.

Please read on to find out more!

English

All our English this term has been around the story of Beowulf, the Anglo Saxon hero who saved a town from the perilous death that Grendel was spreading! We've spent a long time analysing the text and collecting crucial vocabulary. After this, we created our own, vile monsters for Beowulf to defeat, using character descriptions to create wanted posters for the town of Heorot. During the final week of term, we've been writing our own Beowulf saga using these creatures too!



Maths

Our focus in maths this term has been fractions. split into seven Throughout the term, we have looked at key kingdoms. equivalent fractions, converting mixed/improper fractions, as well as ordering and comparing

fractions with different denominators. It has been a tricky process for us, but by using our times tables and division facts to find equivalent fractions to help us along our journey.

Key Question Lessons

Our key question for this term is 'Is Invasion Ever Justified?', where we are basing our learning all around The Vikings and The Anglo-Saxons. To kick off our topic, we started by completing our very own archaeological dig where we dug for Anglo Saxon artefacts and asked historical questions to try and learn more about the civilisations. Through the topic, we have also looked at what physical and human geography features might come into play when

deciding on why you would invade a country, learnt a b o u t t h e different Anglo-Saxon kings and learnt about how the country was split into seven key kingdoms.



It has been a super start to the year. We look forward to continuing this hard work after half term

Year 6 News

This term we have really immersed ourselves in our topic question, 'What would a world without war look like?' So far we have concentrated on the causes of WW2, The Blitz and the effect the war had on families.



English

Our whole class reading book this half term has been, 'When the Sky Falls' by Phil Earle. The children have enjoyed getting to know Joseph (a troubled boy who has been evacuated to the city), and how he learns to understand his own feelings through his relationship with a gorilla

(Adonis).

In writing, we wrote a powerful description about The Blitz. We used lots of the figurative

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language (personification, similes etc) that we had learnt about in the Autumn Term.

Maths

This term we have been learning about ratio and algebra. The children have excelled at using their knowledge of fractions to help them understand ratio and have made good progress learning a new concept in algebra.

Topic

Over the last few weeks, our topic has focussed history and science.

History

History has been the main focus of our topic this term. We have learnt about the women's land army (and the role of



women in WW2) and we wrote a letter to a young woman trying to persuade her to come and work at our

farm. We found out about evacuees and how they were different from refugees. We were amazed about rationing and what people actually ate in the war. Perhaps our question should have been, 'How could people live in a world without pizza or McDonalds!?'.



Science

We have started investigating light in Science and thinking about how the properties of light were used for attack and defence during WW2. We know you need to have light in order to see and that the blackout prevented German bombers from identifying targets.

PE

In PE, the children have been learning racket skills with Mr Edwards and Gymnastics in Indoor PE. It has been wonderful seeing so many children gain confidence in skills such as tumbling and vaulting.

We hope you all have a healthy half-term break.

I liaise with teachers and teaching assistants to help support the pupil's needs and discuss appropriate actions that will help reduce any barriers to their learning. If you have any SEND concerns, please initially talk to your child's class teacher.

Information for parents

ASDA café: Kids eat for £1.

Bella Italia: Kids eat for £1 with the purchase of an adult main course. Available between 4pm to 6pm Monday to Thursday.

Bill's: Kids eat free at Bill's all day from February 13 to 24 when an adult orders any main dish (breakfast, lunch or dinner).
