The teachers have added their personal comments to the information that is automatically generated from our end of term assessments. If there is data missing from the progress section, this is likely due to your children not being with us at the start of the year or it is the first term we have assessed a particular subject in this way.

Progress is calculated, as a number, based on where the children were at the start of the year compared with where they are at the end of last term. To see how the number is generated, please see the table below:

If your child has a score of 0 (zero), this is exactly what we would expect. They have started at a certain standard and with the new learning of the year group, they have stayed at the same standard. If they have a +1 or +2, this means they have made accelerated progress. If they have a -1 / -2 it means that they have found the content of the year's curriculum a challenge and are not quite where we would like them to be.
