#### What are SATs?

- A standardised test that is sat by all Year 6 pupils across the country.
- ▶ The Government uses them to assess how well schools are teaching children.
- Secondary schools use a mixture of information from Year 6 teachers to make decisions on how to best support pupils in Year 7.
- Secondary schools will also use their own assessment systems so SATs provide a good opportunity for children to practice taking an exam and show what they are capable of.
- MYTH: SATs are not an entry exam. Your child WILL be accepted into their secondary school irrelevant of how well they do in their tests.

## How long do they last?

Test	Time allowance
Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Paper 1 (Punctuation and Grammar)	45 minutes
Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Paper 2 (Spelling)	~15 minutes
English Reading	1 hour
Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic)	30 minutes
Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning)	40 minutes
Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning)	40 minutes

#### Arrangements

- Children will need to be in school by <u>8:45am</u>.
- We will take a register and then the children will be provided with a small cold breakfast (e.g. fruit and cereal).
- They will need to have eaten before they come to school.
- The papers will be sat in the morning with children in various rooms across the school.
- An adult will be in every room to administer the test.
- Children should not bring in their own equipment for this. We have to provide the equipment for them.
- No electronic equipment is permitted, including smart watches.
- Children will have a break before their next lesson/paper they sit.

#### Expectations

- These are formal exams and therefore we have very high expectations of behaviour. Children must:
  - Be silent from the moment they are seated
  - Raise their hand if they have a question or need to go to the toilet
  - Keep their answer booklet closed until asked
  - Only look at their own answer booklet
  - Stay silently seated until the exam is finished
  - Not discuss answers with another candidate during the exam

#### What you can do to help:

- We are going to keep a calm atmosphere all week and the children just need to see it as a normal part of school, with nothing to get worried about.
- We would appreciate your support in helping to reassure and encourage your children.
- Children are not expected to revise for this, the exams are on content we have covered in class.
- If you feel that it would put your child's mind at ease to do some preparation feel free to encourage them to practice their times tables and read their books!

### **Results and Grading**

- Results will be published at the beginning of July. We usually send out the results with our end of year parent reports.
- The tests are graded using the terms: Exceeding, Expected, Working Towards, Below.
