Dear Parents / Carers,

We have reached the end of another learning-filled term and it brings us even closer to the end of another academic year. Plans are being formalised with our staffing structure for September and once it has been finalised, I will share it with you all.

There have been lots of interest in the vacancies that have arisen and despite it being extremely difficult to recruit teachers (particularly in the South East) we are never short of people who want to join the Highwood team. I always get a huge sense of pride showing potential candidates around our school. Everyone always gives similar feedback as to how warm, friendly and calm our setting is and how purposeful the learning is in each of our classrooms. You should be as proud of your children as we are about how they conduct themselves whilst in school.

An exciting development that will start next term is our use of VR Headsets. We have invested in a year group set of Class VR technology to further develop the enrichment of our curriculum. The teachers will receive training next term and



our curriculum will be updated to make sure that, where it adds content to the children's learning, we make use of this exciting resource.

Prior to using the VR sets with children, we will share our VR policy, so that parents are fully aware of how the technology will be used in classrooms. We will also offer a parent workshop, so that you can experience the technology yourselves and ask us any questions. Exciting times!!!



Most recently, we learnt about creatures that live in the garden. The children really enjoyed learning about this group of animals. They went on a mini beast hunt around the school grounds, collected some insects in pots to look at and learnt about the importance of being gentle with living creatures. When learning about mini beasts, we have also had a fantastic opportunity to grow our own butterflies. They are still in their cocoons at the moment but we have enjoyed the process so far and we are looking forward to seeing them come out as butterflies.







We have been beginning to practice for our sports day. We have been doing the egg and spoon race, the weaving through the cones race, the sack race, penalty shooting and beanbag balancing. 

Which animal would you invite for tea?

Science and Geography

This term we have been learning about the climate of different parts of the world and what makes some places hot and some cold. We have learnt about where different animals live and had great fun investigating habitats around the school and making our own to attract different animals. We have also looked at what animals eat and how they find

food.

Maths

In Maths we have been working really hard through our Mastery Flow and doing a variety of Do, Think, Explore and Solve tasks. We have practiced multiplication and division, focusing on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We have used this to help us with grouping and sharing and investigating how we can make equal groups. We have loved doing lots of practical activities to show this in different ways. We have started looking at fractions and how we can find a half and a quarter.

English

Our main text this term has been The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We have loved using the story sacks to help us to retell the stories. We have been writing letters to and from the Tiger, Hot Seating characters and acting out parts of the story. We have been working really hard on using



conjunctions in our sentences too. We are now focusing on creating a tiger information poster. We are researching using iPads, books and videos.

<u>Art</u>

We have been learning about printing in Art and have looked at the work of William Morris. We have practiced designing our own repeating patterns using sponge shapes. We are looking forward to practising our colour mixing again to print some animal

shapes and challenge ourselves to repeat these.




Year 3 News

How can we help protect our planet?



LITERACY

We have been looking at the story of The Great Kapok tree in English. In the story, animals from the rainforest tell a huntsman why he should save the rainforest and not cut down the great tree. We retold the story using our own descriptions of the animals. We are also enjoying learning more about the rainforest and the Maya civilisation in whole class reading.

MATHS

In maths, we have been looking at fractions. We discussed what is meant by equivalence, its link to the word equal, and that parts can only be equivalent if they are equal themselves! We have started to revise time and are looking forward to learning more soon!

SCIENCE

In science, we have been exploring the different rainforest layers with a focus on plants. We have been experimenting with what plants need to grow and have discovered that they need sunlight, oxygen, warmth and water. We have also looked at the different parts of a plant and their functions.



TOPIC



We began our topic by learning about tropical rainforests, in particular, the Amazon. We learned about the layers of the rainforest and what vegetation and creatures are found in each layer. We know where tropical rainforests are located and have compared our local area with lquitos, known as the gateway to the Amazon.

If you could find some time at home to support with this as well it will make a huge difference to their knowledge and their Multiplication Test coming up after May half-term.

Writing

Our English this term started with a focus on writing a story opener based on our class reading book 'Flotsam'. The children thoroughly enjoyed inventing a scenario to why a robot fish had appeared in the water. They were able to create a scene, character and mysterious ending of what might happen to the fish next.

Recently, we moved onto explanation texts about how a coast is formed. We have been building on our skills of causal conjunctions, time connectives and writing in

Science

investigating how electricity is generated and the dangers that can come with it. The children got the buzz for learning more when we introduced building circuits.

They have loved learning how to build a circuit to turn on a lightbulb and fix circuits that are not working independently. They have also been fascinated by learning which items within the classroom are conductors and insulators. We cannot wait to put all our


How do you build an empire?

Welcome to the Year 5 news! I am pleased to say that we've had lots of exciting opportunities and lots of new learning going on. Please read on to find out more!

English

All our English this term has been about Greek myths, linking to our key question 'How do you build an empire?' We spent a long time looking at Greek myths and learning what would go in our 'tool kit' for writing a myth, before exploring the different characters and settings we might see. From here, we created our own mythical creatures for our hero to defeat, creating character descriptions, and finally, we are starting to write and then publish our own myths.





Key Question Lessons

Our key question this term is 'How do you build an empire?' Our focus is on the Greeks and how they have influenced the modern world. We've explored where Greece is and the land that they occupied during the Ancient Greek reign, as well as looking at the human and physical geography of Greece and comparing it to where we are in the south of the UK. Since then, we've moved on to look at the history side, exploring Greek Gods and making our own top trumps cards

The focus at the beginning of this term was SATs. We spent the first 3 weeks practising, so that when the SATs finally arrived, we realised that they weren't as scary as we all thought! The children worked extremely hard and we were very proud of their positive attitude despite some extremely difficult papers. Well done Year 6!!

Once SATs were over, we were able to begin to answer the question:

'What is the secret to success?'

English

As readers, and writers, we immersed ourselves in the story of Ernest Shackleton and his ill-fated expedition to the South Pole. We thought about the question: 'What does it mean to be successful?' and debated whether Shackleton achieved success (as he never made it to the South Pole). We took inspiration from the beautifully illustrated book by Will Grill, 'Shackleton's Journey' and wrote a persuasive letter to Shackleton to apply to be part of his crew.





Geography

We used our geography lessons to help us evaluate the enormity of Shackleton's expedition. We learnt about longitude and latitude to have an understanding of just how far he travelled; we



learnt about day length and seasons in the Antarctic and how the Earth's tilt causes it to have opposite seasons from the Arctic; and biomes.

History

In History we have enjoyed learning about our local area; thinking about how the past has influenced the present and how the present is shaping the future. We really enjoyed analysing old photos of Woodley and comparing them to images from today.

Science

In order to answer the question, 'What's the secret to a healthy body?', we have begun to study the circulatory system and how the heart works. This will help us to understand what we need in order to lead a healthy lifestyle.

PE

With Mr Edwards, the children have been taking part in athletics and did themselves proud in the 600m! With Mr Robinson and Mrs Partridge we have enjoyed making the most of the warmer weather by playing various games of rounders and capture the flag!

PE Lessons:







Children in Reception, Years 1 & 2 are entitled to universal free school meals, funded by the government. If your child would like a school dinner please let the class teacher know and this will be booked for them.

Children in Nursery, Years 3 to 6 are required to pay for dinners. The price of a school dinner is £2.30 per day. Payment should be made via SCOPAY in advance.

If you think your child may be eligible for benefits related free school meals please contact the school office for a form.

Please note that we are a NUT-FREE school.



ABSENCE

Please contact the school office by 9.30am if your child is absent stating the reason for the absence. This can be done via the Arbor Portal/APP or by phone on 0118 9265493.

If your child is going to be late and requires a hot dinner this must be booked by 9.30am.
