Everything they ate had to be caught or collected. Write your own recipe for a stone age dinner using ingredients that would be available and then try it out on your family.</p>	<p>Your choice. Pick an activity to do with someone in your family. Explain how you had to work-together in order to achieve it.</p>	<p>Write a poem about the Prehistoric Age and then teach someone how to perform it. Do not forget to show your teacher!</p>	<p>Choose an area of maths we have covered this term. Teach someone in your family how to do it. Remember to ask them probing questions.</p>	<p>Help your parents prepare a meal this week. You could do some cooking, chopping and even washing up! Explain what you did in your book.</p>	<p>Present, show or tell other adult 10 facts about anything you have learnt this term and ask them to sign your book as proof!</p>
	<p>Pick some of the times tables you're not sure of to practice. Use Times Table Rockstars to help and see if you can improve your speed. How many can you answer in 3 minutes?</p>	<p>Your Choice! Pick a skill you would like to master. E.g. sewing, cooking or tennis. Practice your skill and show how you have improved over time.</p>	<p>Challenge someone in the class or your teacher on Times Table Rockstars. See if you can beat your score each time.</p>	<p>Could you run/walk 2Km?! See how long it would take you.</p>	<p>Make a picture out of rocks! Think carefully about how to arrange the rocks and take a photograph. Take your time and persevere to make your work look brilliant!</p>	<p>One of the main skills you need to become an expert author is the ability to remember new vocabulary. Find 10 new words from books, magazines or your parents and memorise what they mean.</p>	<p>Think of the trickiest thing you had to do this term. Explain how you used perseverance to help you overcome it.</p>
	<p>Find out what each of the following ages were recognised for: the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age.</p>	<p>Write a diary entry imagining you are a prehistoric age man or woman and describe what you did during the day, what you wore, what you ate and what you saw!</p>	<p>Watch an episode of the Flintstones on YouTube and write a detailed paragraph explaining what the episode was about. Include a picture!</p>	<p>Find out about Skara Brae (a group of preserved prehistoric houses) using books from the library or the internet. Create a written leaflet or PowerPoint with pictures and facts about Skara Brae.</p>	<p>Write a non-chronological report all about Rocks. Remember to include key features such as title, sub heading, key phrases and technical vocabulary.</p>	<p>One of the Highwood values is happiness.
