# What are SATs?

- ▶ A standardised test that is sat by all Year 6 pupils across the country.
- ▶ The Government uses them to assess how well schools are teaching children.
- ▶ Secondary schools use SATs results and information from Year 6 teachers to make decisions on how to best support pupils in Year 7.
- ▶ Secondary schools will also use their own assessment systems so SATs provide a good opportunity for children to practise sitting an assessment and show what they are capable of.

Mathematics	Wednesday 14th May	Mathematics Arithmetic (Paper 1)	30 Minutes	40	Involves mathematical calculations covering all four operations (+ - x ÷) including fractions, decimals and percentages.
		Mathematics Reasoning (Paper 2)	40 Minutes	35	Both of these papers assess mathematical fluency, with word problems and reasoning. All 3 maths paper's scores are added together to give a final mark.

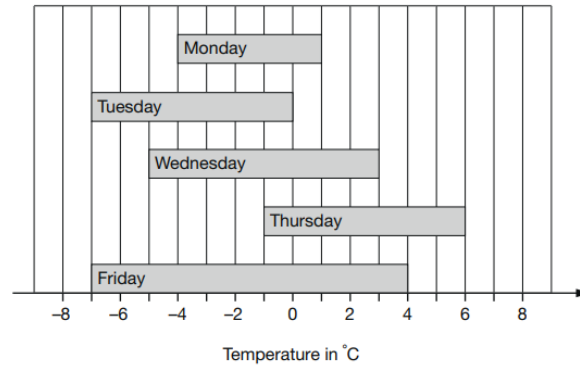

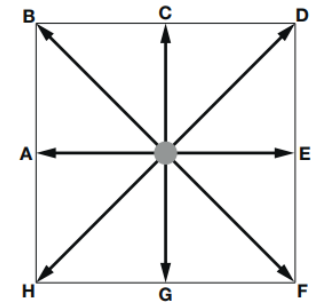

# Mock SATs Week: 28th April 2025 to 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025

- ▶ Our termly NFER assessments are an almost identical format to SATs so the children are already used to completing the papers and the type of questions they will be asked.
- ▶ Mocks SATs are an opportunity for children to become familiar with the logistics and other arrangements for SATs: the room, the adult(s), the equipment, the timings and completing their personal information.

# Breakfast Club

- ▶ On the days when SATs are taking place, a breakfast club will be offered to the children if there is enough interest.
- ▶ It will start at 8am and be held in the school hall.
- ▶ Breakfast will include a bowl of cereal, toast and a piece of fruit.
- ▶ This allows your child to be in school in plenty of time and will help them relax before the tests start. No revision will take place during this time.
- ▶ If your child does not attend the breakfast club, they **MUST** still be in school by 8.45am at the very latest.

# Arrangements

- ▶ Children must be in school by 8:45am.
- ▶ The papers will be sat in the morning with children in various rooms across the school.
- ▶ An adult will be in every room to administer the assessment.
- ▶ Children should not bring in their own equipment for this. We have to provide the equipment for them.
- ▶ No electronic equipment is permitted, including smart watches.
- ▶ Children will have a break before their next lesson or the next paper they sit.
- ▶ Some children may require extra support or time during the tests. If this applies to your child, we will speak to you about it beforehand.

# Expectations

These are formal exams and therefore we have very high expectations of behaviour.

Children must:

- ▶ Be silent from the moment they are seated
- ▶ Raise their hand if they have a question or need to go to the toilet
- ▶ Keep their answer booklet closed until asked
- ▶ Only look at their own answer booklet
- ▶ Stay silently seated until the exam is finished
- ▶ Not discuss answers with another candidate during the exam

# What can you do at home to help?

- ▶ We will maintain a calm, positive atmosphere all week and the children just need to see it as a normal part of school, with nothing to get worried about.
- ▶ We would appreciate your support in helping to reassure and encourage your children.
- ▶ Children are not expected to revise for this. The exams are on content we have covered in class.
- ▶ If you feel that it would put your child's mind at ease to do some preparation feel free to encourage them to practise their times tables, core maths skills and read their books!

# Results and Grading

- ▶ All SATs test papers are sent off to be externally marked.
- ▶ Results will be published at the beginning of July. We usually send out the results with our end of year parent reports.
- ▶ Your child will be given a scaled score (between 80 and 120) which helps determine their grading.
- ▶ The tests are graded using the terms: Exceeding, Expected, Working Towards, Below.
